



Welcome to the Parish of St. Symphorosa & St. Rene!!

Baseball fans love hearing the words, “Pitchers and catchers report.”

This is the first sign that winter is waning, and the baseball season is just around the corner. Players report to Spring Training and use that time to “Get Back to Basics.”

Fundamentals are not assumed. Even the most veteran player revisits how to throw the ball, catch the ball, hit the ball.

We too, as Catholics, have our “Get Back to Basics” season. We call this span of time Lent. Even the most seasoned veteran disciple among us takes time to answer God’s first question in Sacred Scripture. In the Genesis story, after Adam and Eve indulged from the tree of knowledge of good and evil, they went and hid themselves from God.

God called to the man and asked, “Where are you?”

Hmmm! That is a very good question for us as we begin our 2021 Lenten journey. Where are we?

God knew where Adam was hiding, but the Lord asks the question so that Adam will take the time to consider what has happened. He sinned, then he went and hid from God. In a sense, God wants the man to see that the relationship with God has been affected, and not for the better. And yet, God came in search of His creation. Love does such things.

Take a moment TODAY and get still, get silent. Hear God ask you the same question posed to Adam in the garden. “Where are you?”

Are we “good” with God, or have we, in some way, gone into hiding? Lent is a penitential season and is a good time to be honest with yourself

about sin.

The First Letter of John reminds us, “If we say we have no sin in us, we are deceiving ourselves and refusing to admit the truth; but if we acknowledge our sins, the God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and purify us from everything that is wrong. To say that we have never sinned is to call God a liar and to show that his word is not in us.”

We can keep in mind with us these weeks of Lent the Three Paths to Holiness identified by Bishop Robert Barron, auxiliary bishop of Los Angeles and Chicago native: 1. Find your center. 2. Know you’re a sinner. 3. Your life is not about you.

Perhaps we’ve lost sight of who is No. 1 during the past year. The Lord is Numero Uno. He is our Center. Everything else flows from that relationship. In light of that, we recognize we are wounded human beings who fall on occasion. Humility is needed to confess our sins and to get back up. Lastly, we are not the center of the universe. We are all instruments God desires to use for mission; to proclaim the good news of salvation and be attentive to the needs of our neighbor. Selfishness and Christian discipleship are like oil and water. They don’t mix.

Trusting in the mercy of God, we need not hide from God in the trees of the garden. Instead, we humble ourselves in the Lord’s presence, come out from hiding, confess our sins, and respond to God’s question by saying, “Here I am, Lord. Send me.”

Mondays During Lent

Each Monday during Lent we want

to have special time set aside for prayer.

We will be hosting a series of Holy Hours and a Taize service. Each Monday service will begin at 7 P.M. inside the St. Rene Church. Stay tuned for more specifics.

The only exception will be this year’s Mission held on March 1, 2021. We welcome Fr. Connor Danstrom to the parish. He will speak to us on the importance of silence in the spiritual life, and share his witness, as well. He is a priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago (ordained 2014) and is currently the chaplain for the John Paul II Catholic Center on the campus of the University of Illinois-Chicago.

The first Holy Hour will be Monday, February 22. The Holy Hour will consist of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Sacred Scripture, brief reflection, silent time for prayer, and Benediction.

Come join us and spend time with Our Savior.

In the Mass offered by Catholics who are fully in communion with the Church but retain their Anglican heritage of liturgy, their Collect speaks eloquently of our vigorous participation with God in the new Lenten season: “O Lord, who for our sake didst fast forty days and forty nights: give us grace to use such abstinence, that, our flesh being subdued to the Spirit, we may ever obey thy godly motions in righteousness and true holiness, to thy honour and glory;” (*Divine Worship: The Missal*) In this third prayer, the Church again prays with confidence in the promise of what God will accomplish for her even when the tinges of discomfort from abstinence and repentance gnaw at us.

Notice that the three Collects (and almost all of them for that matter) are spoken in a plurality, “we,” “us,” “our.” Fr. 
