

Allow me to say thank you to all those who have called the rectory or sent a note just wanting to say hello and see how I am doing during this difficult and challenging time. Although I cannot begin to return all the calls or letters, let this be my sincere thank you for caring about me as your pastor, your shepherd. Please know you are all in prayers.

One of the things I miss most is seeing all of your faces at Holy Mass. I know, I know, you say "Fr. Bob, but you close your eyes a lot when you sit in your chair. How do you see me?" Believe me, I see you. And the Lord sees you. We are human beings and we are not wired to shelter in place forever, or to perpetually live socially distant from one another.

There are important health and safety reasons why we are engaging the physical distancing from one another, but how can we not see the way the diabolic uses something like this current pandemic to try and distance us from God and from one another. Remember, the word diabolic means "to tear apart." Hmmm!

Please do your best to stay spiritually focused during these trying times. Pray! Pray! Pray!

Don't just say your prayers, actually sit down in silence and stillness and spend time with the Lord. Share what's on your mind and heart, then make sure you stop talking and listen. Listen! The Lord wants to share something special -- that He loves you so much; more than you may know.

That's tough for some people to believe. For many years I struggled to believe God could love me so much. And on some dark days, that old liar and murderer tries to get me to doubt God's love once again. But God's love isn't fickle like our human love. Our love often has strings attached, which means it's not actually love, but selfishness disguised as love.

God loves us even when we turn away in sin. Notice, God doesn't turn away. We do. We decide we want something else more than God. Sharon Hersh wonderfully expresses this so well in her book "The Last Addiction" when she writes "We all love something too much."

What she is saying is that we all have something in our life that is NOT GOD that we love as if it were God. This used to be called a false idol. This idol is different for everyone, but it is an idol nonetheless. We need to know our idol; to be honest about it. Whatever your idol (or idols) may be, it is NOT GOD. Thankfully, we have a God of mercy

who forgives a humble contrite heart.

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, be open to God's grace; to God's mercy. Embrace the grace! Reject the lies that emerge from the Liar and Murderer and from those who cooperate with deceit, discouragement, division and diversion. Trust in Jesus. Grab hold of his nailed-marked hand and walk the walk He has shown us by His suffering, death, resurrection and ascension.

The Cross is not the end of the story. Easter is our hope. New life. God's love ... forever!

What if they learn to stretch a dollar and to live with less?


What if they learn to plan shopping trips and meals at home?

Our Catholic Faith By Fr. Bob Regan

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

On occasion a person walks into my confessional and begins by saying, "Father, it's been such a long time since I've gone to confession."

Instead of waving a finger and chastising the person for such a prolonged absence, I smile and explain to the person that we should stop for a moment and recognize that the Holy Spirit has moved their heart and that they have cooperated with God's grace and come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

"How long has it been?" I ask.

"Um, I'd say, 30 maybe 40 years," he says.

Secretly, in my own mind, I shout "YES!" because here is a prodigal son or daughter coming to their senses, turning around, and heading home to receive the Father's mercy. The prerequisite to receive the Father's mercy is having a humble heart that is truly sorry for one's sins, and a firm intention to not sin.

Are we likely to sin again? You betcha, but as we engage the sacrament of reconciliation and prepare to receive absolution, we must be sorry and intend to leave the confessional with a firm purpose of amendment.

Go get your Bible today and turn to Luke's Gospel (15: 11-32) and read the entire story of the parable of

the prodigal son and his brother. Notice how the father receives the "run-away" son once the son wakes up and realizes his life had gone astray. The father knew the son was sorry and wanted to change the direction of his life, so the father celebrates the son's return home by extending abundant mercy "for this son of mine was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found."

Jesus gave us a very concrete avenue to receive forgiveness for having turned away from God and chosen a life of sin over life in Christ. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is the Sacrament of Mercy. We wake up and realize how silly it was to walk away from the Father to indulge our wayward passions. Things aren't so bad living in the embrace of the Father's love.

Once this whole CoVID-19 pandemic subsides and life returns to some sense of normalcy, please find time sit down, exam your conscience, see where you have turned away from God and chosen sin, and prepare to engage the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Mercy awaits your humble contrite heart.

And if you are behind the screen when you arrive to confess your sins, please know I am smiling because you showed up and I got to be the instrument Jesus extends His healing mercy.



Faith Formation Classes


Classes for Grades 1-8 are offered on Wednesday evenings from 6:00-7:30pm.
