Welcome to Two Holy Martyrs Parish!!

Bruce Springsteen sang to us as the 1970s turned into the 1980s. The Jersey Shore native belted out "Everybody's got a Hungry Heart."

Well, we've sailed two decades into the new millennium and the same lyrics hold true – everybody's got a hungry heart. We know physical hunger quite well. Daily life finds us opening up the refrigerator for a little something to satisfy this hunger.

There's another kind of hunger – a spiritual hunger. Some folks deny or refute this claim, but in our more honest moments, we recognize the God-shaped hole that nothing in this world can ever completely fill. But, oh boy, do we try to fill it with this or that.

Just as we experience physical hunger and seek food to satisfy that hunger, so too, we experience spiritual hunger and seek the Source to satiate that yearning.

This weekend we begin making our way through the sixth chapter of John's Gospel. Please take time soon to sit down, open up your Bible, and prayerfully make your way through ALL of chapter six. This is a crucial chapter where Jesus satisfies the physical hunger of the crowd, AND prepares the way to satisfy us spiritually in the gift of the Eucharist.

Take a look around and notice how many people are trying to fill the spiritual void with something or someone who can't ultimately fill the void. Even married couples have to mature to the realization that their partner is NOT God and that the one should stop expecting him or her to fill the shoes only the divine can adequately fill. It's unfair to expect of fellow human beings to fill in the God-shaped hole. It's God-shaped for a reason.

Now is the time for us to wake up and intentionally turn to Christ. He always meets us where we are at, not where others expect us to be. You might say, "But Lord, I am a sinner." He smiles at you and says, "I know. I've known you your entire life. I created you. Yes, you are a sinner, but that's exactly who I am came for. You! Let me fill that God-shaped hole."

Everybody's got a hungry heart. Eat well, physically. Eat well, spiritually. Amen!

This kind of social event is so important for various reasons, but mainly because we are, at the end of the day, social beings. We also hope to see some neighbors who maybe we haven't seen in a while. The Picnic is NOT Family Fest, but it is an opportunity (outside of Mass or a ministry event) to gather as a Christian family and welcome anyone who strolls in.

Did You Yell BINGO?

We're thrilled to have welcomed back to the parish grounds our monthly Bingo.

Once we received the green light to start re-opening for larger groups, we assembled a Bingo Re-opening committee so that we could host these in our parish and community for those who enjoy getting out of the house and playing a little Bingo.

Flannery Hall on the St. Rene campus has had some improvements since we last called Bingo. We installed new brighter cost-efficient lights and a few ceiling fans. The hall floor was stripped and waxed. The hall was nicely airconditioned.

We had in excess of 110 players for Bingo on Sunday, July 18th.

Allow me to THANK everyone who VOLUNTEERS to help run Bingo. This is quite an undertaking and the folks who raise their hands to help do so out of love for their parish and enjoyment of being part of our parish bingo. The monthly Bingo is a parish-sponsored event with revenue received finding its home in the parish's general account.

The Bingo volunteers are also an example of how parishioners of former parishes can unite and work together as one newly-united parish. Believe me, I am fully aware this isn't an easy transition to make. I am not naïve to the internal struggle that goes on. We've been challenged to embrace something new and it takes time. Honor the past, live in the present, prepare for the future.



SPECIAL NOTICE TO OUR PARISHIONERS AND NEIGHBORS

Two Holy Martyrs parish staff was approached a few months ago by the leaders of The American Quality Schools Corporation. Their representatives showed interest in using one of our parish buildings to be the home of a new private high school. This would NOT be a charter school, but a privately funded high school.

We entered into a few weeks of discussion before determining to move forward in being the home for Harbridge College Prep Academy.

This private high school would require a minimum of 100 students to begin, and would limit school capacity to roughly 400 students. Should the school get the necessary 100 students, they would open their doors in Autumn of 2022. Marketing and recruitment of students would begin in September 2021.

This private high school is seeking to be an alternative for families who want a choice that isn't Chicago Public Schools or a private religious institution.

Harbridge College Prep Academy describes itself as an innovative, high quality, non-sectarian, independent high school. This school is not affiliated with the Archdiocese of Chicago nor Chicago Public Schools. Two Holy Martyrs parish would serve as the lessor, and would receive an agreed upon financial compensation. Harbridge Academy would be housed in the school building on the St. Rene campus. The school building formerly housed one of the local Polish schools. The building would still be used by Two Holy Martyrs Parish for social events, religious education, bingo, etc..

The American Quality Schools Corporation was founded 21 years ago by Dr. Michael Bakalis. Since then, they have opened and/or operated 20 elementary and secondary schools in Illinois, Indiana and Missouri. They have operated three of the highest academic achieving schools in Chicago, two of the highest academic achieving schools in the entire state of Indiana, and the highest achieving new charter school in Missouri.


"Our goal is to prepare students to be accepted and succeed in the nations very top-tier universities and colleges," said Bakalis. "It will eventually, after three years, become a true international school." He also added, "Our new school will also focus on the importance of students becoming actively engaged in the areas of ethical behavior, values and good character."

Dr. Michael Bakalis' credentials are numerous. He is a graduate of Northwestern University and taught at the junior high and high school level. After receiving his Ph. D from Northwestern, he taught at Northern Illinois University. He has also been involved with Loyola University, Triton College, and the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern.

He was elected and served as Illinois State Superintendent of Education and as Illinois State Comptroller. Through Presidential appointment, he served as Deputy Undersecretary of Education in the U.S. Department of Education.

Dr. Bakalis is passionate about providing our young children with a quality high school education and we look forward to Harbridge College Prep Academy being a success, and an option for families looking for a high school.

Next weekend is the Missionary Cooperation Plan, the annual collection that allows missionaries from around the world to share their stories and invite support from our parishes. Unfortunately, the missionaries could not send speakers to visit us due to the global pandemic. 104 mission causes are participating thus year and ask for our cooperation to continue their missionary efforts. There are dioceses, religious sisters, brothers and priests, as well as school, orphanages and medical clinics that need out prayer and support.

For example, the **Orphanage of the Virgin of Guadalupe in the Philippines** is run by the Sisters of Mary Adorers of the Holy Eucharist. It is a home for infants left behind in hospitals after birth as well as street children, runaways, orphans,

abandoned and homeless children. It also has become a home for victims of human trafficking and rape. A good number of babies have been born there. Like mothers, the nuns respond to the children's needs, feed infants with bottled milk and spoon-feed the toddlers. They check babies' temperature, bring them to hospitals for medical help, or rise from sleep when the babies cry. These children have survived the worst, but the orphanage gives them a way our of poverty and trauma. Many children learn and grow to contribute to society: A two-month old baby girl was sold to the priest who founded the Orphanage for the equivalent of \$42, and she is now a pharmacist. An eight-month old baby boy was abandoned in a jeep and now he is a foreman in a construction firm. A six-year old battered girl now wishes to take up Social Work to help in the orphanage.

- 10. It's our job: Jesus sent us to "go and teach all nations".



"O God, protector of those who hope in you, without whom nothing has firm foundation, nothing is holy, bestow in abundance your mercy upon us and grant that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may use the good things that pass in such a way as to hold fast even now to those that ever endure. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever." (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.) The Collect, the opening prayer for this Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, describes the reality in which we live and then petitions God that we may engage this reality in a faith-filled manner. Astutely, the Church distinguishes between two ways of living and subsequently a choice: our life and existence viewed in relation to God versus being viewed without God. Similarly, another choice present in this prayer is

how to "use the good things that pass," either "in such a way as to hold fast even now to those [things] that ever endure" or to use these same good things for a different end and purpose, one which falls short of or detours away from eternity with God.

Near the end of the Book of Deuteronomy, God speaks to His Chosen People, Israel, as they are nearing the end of their protracted exodus from Egypt and on the cusp of entering the Promised Land. In quick succession, God announces to His beloved children, "See, I have today set before you life and good, death and evil." (Deuteronomy 30:15) Then, He repeats, "I call heaven and earth today to witness against you: I have set before you life and death, the blessing and the curse. Choose life, then, that you and your descendants may live, by loving the LORD, your God, obeying his voice, and holding fast to him." (Deuteronomy 30:19 -20) To choose God is to choose being itself, the "maker ... of all things visible and invisible," (Nicene Creed) and thus our "firm foundation." God's very nature and being are holy; thus, to choose God is to choose holiness. From the good things, which God grants to us, we can choose to use them toward life in God or choose to misuse them, resulting in separation from God.

St. Paul presents a similar distinction and choice to the Ephesian Christians: "I, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace:". (Ephesians 4:1-3) The Apostle "urges" this community of the early Church to live in accord with the faith into which they have been baptized but he cannot compel them to act in this corresponding manner. The choice remains theirs.

Among the good things or those, which we might call neutral, not inherently good or evil on the moral level, what have been your recent choices, how have you used the following:

- 1. Your ability to communicate, either with spoken words or through digital means, is it consistent with a follower of God? Does your communication point the other person to God?
- 2. Your time, is all of the day lived with God, which includes not just our prayer but our ordinary daily activities, or is some of the time closed off to God, lived without Him?
- 3. Your food and drink, is there enjoyment of these goods yet with moderation, or are they used to excess?
- 4. Your internet usage, does it draw you to God or away from Him?

You are encouraged to check this spot every week and witness "Thought Seeds" being planted into our figurative parish garden. 
