Welcome to the Parish of St. Symphorosa & St. Rene!!

Imagine you are standing next to some earthly figure you admire and have been following for a few years, and this person stops, points and says, "There, right there, is the lamb of God."

You might respond, "Huh? Who?"

Our Gospel this weekend has such a scenario, and the two disciples of John the Baptist knew the object of John's finger was a Person of significance. The two students got curious and soon left John's side to follow the other fellow.

His name is Jesus and he turns around and looks them in the eyes. What happens next is a question that echoes through the centuries and make us stop and look deep into our heart.

"What are you looking for?" he says. They ask a question back and then Jesus invites them to "come and see."

Now imagine the Son of God and Son of Man asking you the same probing question; a question that makes you go beyond superficialities to a much more eternal search. What's your answer? What are you truly looking for in this life?

Here is the interesting thing. The One asking the question is, at the end of the day, the Answer. Jesus asks the question and Jesus is the Answer. They followed Him and stayed with Him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon – IT WAS 4 P.M..

The time of day is significant because it was a momentous decision in their life; the decision to make Jesus the one they'd follow as their Teacher, capital T. There are really only a handful of significant moments in our entire life, and the decision to follow Jesus without reservation is one of those decisions, and, in reality, THE most important decision.

Have you had your 4 P.M. moment? If not, are you open to arriving at that moment of your life? We can't sit on the fence of indifference our entire life. We must make the choice to say YES to God or NO to God; yes to accepting Jesus'

invitation to come and see, or turning around and walking in the opposite direction.

God loves us, and will accept our decision. Love does not coerce. He sent His love. He desires we receive it. May we all reach our 4 P.M. moment and walk humbly together with the Lord in this life so that we may live happily forever with Him in the next.

Name Change Realities

Once again we are running a list of five final names for our newly-united parish. A couple things need to be re-emphasized:

Feedback for the name is not a vote. It is feedback the Unification Team and

Pastor will use to prepare a final list to send to the Archbishop of Chicago. The final decision for the name change belongs to Cardinal Cupich. We sent our recommendation, and he listens to the input of his Presbyteral Council.

We had around 40 different names when all initial submissions were compiled. Not everyone's name was going to make the final five. Yes, many of the names were wonderful options for a parish. But to use a sports analogy, we can only have 5 players on the court at a time.

The invitation from the Archbishop of Chicago during this entire Renew My Church process has been to take an honest look at our spiritual life and our parish's finances and facilities. On July 1, 2020, we became a new canonical parish. Certainly, the COVID reality has presented us challenges in our first year, but we look forward to building bridges toward one another as fellow Catholics in the years to come.

The parish school is St. Symphorosa School. The decision was made to leave the school name untouched for the sake of stability and making sure this school option remains so that the Clearing area of Chicago has a Catholic School presence. Our school offers a great education while also forming the hearts of our children in the love of Christ. This school must continue well into the 21-st century. We cannot lose another Catholic school in this area.

Lastly, regardless of the official parish name change, PLEASE, understand that the two worship sites retain their original names. So, we'd have an official parish name (canonically), but St. Rene Church will be just that, and St. Symphorosa Church the same. This is church law stuff that we don't need to get too deep into, but the campus sites retain their respective names as the Parish welcomes her new title. We are ONE parish with two churches (worship sites).

Please continue to pray as we move closer to a final decision.



Final Five List for New Parish Name

The following are the five final names being discerned for our newly-unified parish. We invite you to read through these five names and explanations. After prayerfully reading through them, please consider what moved your heart. What is stirring in you? With that in mind, please select ONE of the options and submit that choice as feedback for our Parish Unification Team.

You can email the ONE name to [symporosa@comcast.net](mailto:symphorosa@comcast.net), you can drop off the name in the parish office, or you can drop the name in the collection basket/box. The Unification Team looks forward to helping us bring this process to completion. There is no need to write an explanation with your ONE name choice. Just the one name will suffice.

1. **Two Holy Martyrs Parish** (sub-name of Symphorosa and Rene Goupil) — This option invites us to adopt a new unifying parish name while retaining the actual saint names as a sub name to the primary name of Two Holy Martyrs. Both St. Symphorosa and St. Rene Goupil are martyrs of the Church; they died for the faith. The new name of Two Holy Martyrs invites us to honor the past history all the while embracing the need to unify as one in the Clearing/Garfield Ridge community of Chicago. The name Two Holy Martyrs also serves to remind us of our present-day call to witness to the faith in a society that is distancing itself from God. The new name would invite us to not remain in the silo of our former parish but to engage the need to come together as we move deeper into the 21st century on mission for Christ.
2. **Parish of Sts. Symphorosa & Rene Goupil** — This name option simply combines the two former parish names into one unifying parish name. Both former parishes enjoyed decades of worship and service. This option seeks to retain the respective histories all the while realizing we need to meet the demands of today's reality as we prepare for the future. The caution with this name choice is that we might continue to think we are two separate parishes and act accordingly by using "Us and Them" language. As of July 1, 2020, we are ONE parish with two worship sites. The upside is that we can see the new parish name of Sts. Symphorosa and Rene Goupil as a "coming together" in Christ to serve this community in the Lord's name.
3. **St. Benezet Parish** — This saint is the patron saint of bridge building and lived between 1163 and 1184. He was a shepherd in France and after a vision, moved to build bridges with great strength. Bridge building was an important development at that time in history. Choosing this name would invite two former parishes to become one with the theme of the bridge serving to unite us in Christ. St. Benezet would also inspire us to go out to those who have drifted away — or those who are distant from God — and serve as a bridge to bring them back to God. Our ability to evangelize — to bring people to Christ — is best served by building bridges and not constructing walls that keep folks away.
4. **Divine Mercy Parish** — This name is inspired by the story of St. Faustina and her call to share the message of Jesus. The Lord spoke to her, "Today I am sending you with My mercy to the people of the whole world. I do not want to punish aching mankind, but I desire to heal it, pressing it to my merciful heart." This new name would invite us to enflame out hearts with the mercy of Christ and bring healing to so many wounded people. One of the challenges of this name is that our neighboring parish of St. Faustina (union of the former St. Jane de Chantal and St. Camillus) shares the same story. Yes, different parish name but same story. Upside would be that we can unite to truly announce mercy to our community and our world. The new name could inspire us deeper into Divine Mercy devotion.
5. **Blessed Solanus Casey Parish** — Bernard Francis Casey was a priest in the United States who was born in Oak Grove, Wisconsin, and died in Detroit. He was known during his lifetime as a wonderworker, a man of deep faith, and as a spiritual counselor. He also ministered devoutly to the sick. Born in 1870, he died in 1957. He was beatified on November 18, 2017. We await his canonization. This is truly a modern-day saint-to-be from the Midwest. So often our saints seem remote and distant, but Blessed Solanus Casey gives us the freshness of ministry from the 20th century as we face the challenges of faith in the 21st century. He once said, "We must be faithful to the present moment or we will frustrate the plan of God for our lives." Our newly-united parish is the present.





Domine, labia mea aperies (Lord, you will open my lips) (Psalm 51:17)

Sunday, January 17, is the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (the First Sunday in Ordinary Time was replaced by the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and Ordinary Time began on Monday, January 11). For about the next month, we will make our way through the weeks of Ordinary Time, following Christ in His public ministry, being reintroduced to the Son of God whose Nativity, Epiphany and Baptism we have recalled and prayed during the prior weeks. Wednesday, February 17, the Church will begin the great Season of Lent, succeeded by the Season of Easter, and pray the texts, which are specific to those two seasons. So, what are praying when we open our lips this Sunday, early in Ordinary Time?

In the Ordinary Form Masses, the form of Mass, which we pray at St. Symphorosa and St. Rene Goupil, in contrast to the Extraordinary Form Masses (the traditional Latin Mass/Tridentine Mass), the Collect is sweeping in its scope, recognizing God as governing all that exists and as the source of our peace: "Almighty ever-living God, who govern all things, both in heaven and on earth, mercifully hear the pleading of your people and bestow your peace on our times. Through our Lord" (*Roman Missal*, 3rd edition)

For Catholics of Anglican heritage (Personal Ordinariate), this liturgical season emphasizes that we are now in a period after the Epiphany; thus, this Sunday is called the Second Sunday after the Epiphany. In the Collect for the Divine Worship of the Mass this Sunday the prayer pairs closely with that of the Ordinary Form Mass, which is formed by the God revelation in Christ Jesus, now being revealed to the world, which traces back to His Epiphany: "Almighty and everlasting God, who dost govern all things in heaven and earth: mercifully hear the supplications of thy people; and grant us thy peace all the days of our life; through Jesus Christ thy Son" (*Divine Worship: The Missal*)

The Latin Mass maintains a precision for this liturgical time similar to that of the Personal Ordinariate, identifying the season as after the Epiphany (or Epiphanytide). For the Latin Mass, the Collect accords with the two above Collects and likely their historical source: "O almighty and everlasting God, who dost govern all things both in heaven and on earth: mercifully hear the prayers of Thy people, and grant us Thy peace in our time. Through our Lord...." (Translation, *The Daily Missal and Liturgical Manual*, Baronius Press, Ltd. 2007)

Across these three distinct expressions of the Church's Liturgy this Sunday, her public prayer and worship of God, she praises and petitions God with concord among her faithful, a good way for us to set forth with our Lord for another year.

What is SPRED?

SPRED (Special Religious Development) is a program which trains and guides parishes to provide faith formation to persons with developmental disabilities and/or learning problems and become integrated into parish life. St. Rene has had a SPRED group for more than 30 years and St. Symphorosa has had a SPRED group for 20 years. Now that our two churches have become one parish, our SPRED ministry has doubled. The need for this ministry is great. And the need for volunteers is great.


