

Fr. Bob's Weekly Blog



"Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every joint with which it is supplied, when each part is working properly, makes bodily growth and upbuilds itself in love." Ephesians 15: 15-16

Today's readings are quite sobering.

We live in a culture that seeks to sanitize death. If you bring up the inevitability of our death, you're seen as morbid; or at the very least a Debbie Downer.

And yet, it is living with the end in mind that gives perspective to each and every day. If you believe the body's death is truly the end, then it is no wonder anxiety and angst begin to rule the day.

As Christians, however, we believe death does not have the final say. The sorrow of Good Friday blossoms into the glory of Easter Sunday. Jesus' suffering, death, resurrection and ascension conquered sin, death, and evil. Jesus invites everyone to share in this Pascal Mystery. Yes, we die. Yes, we live again. That's why we can be JOY-filled, even amidst earthly chaos.

Many choose to accept the invitation; but far too many have chosen, and will continue to choose, to say "No thanks."

With the glory of heaven dismissed, we then seek to build our own heaven here on earth. We pile up riches, build bigger houses, entertain ourselves to death, amass more stuff, and fight over material goods; all in an effort to control what we can control. In reality, there is very little in life we actually control (Think about that for a while).

Jesus says in today's Gospel, "You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong? Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God.

Reality check: there are no U-Haul trailers attached to hearses in funeral processions (at least not that I have yet seen).

Anyone who has ever lost a loved one eventually has to go through their possessions – aka their stuff. This can be very difficult. Once the tears have dried, we realize we might keep a few sentimental things, but what about the rest? Usually ends up being given away (Salvation Army, St. Vincent DePaul, a friend in need).

Our STUFF does not go with us, but our LOVE does, because love is stronger than death. There is that wise saying that goes something like this ... "The only thing you take with you when you die is what you have given away." It will be your love – your charity – that survives the grave.

If the Lord were to call you Home this evening, would you be ready?

That's a sobering question.

The world continues to play its silly little power games. Some politicians continue to play the lie/deception game (and some bishops join them), some business icons amass billions,

some rich celebrities lose sight of reality and begin telling you how to live, and some religious leaders lose sight of the Gospel of Jesus and replace it with the luxurious self-centered Gospel of Me.

Today's readings invite us to regain perspective. We will die (that's a fact) -- but thanks be to God (to Jesus) we shall live ... FOREVER.

Don't worry about the stuff you're leaving behind. Think TODAY about what you're going to take with you. For where your treasure it, there your heart will be also. What is your heart set on?

What's it Mean? Catholic Vocabulary

<u>Pectoral Cross</u>

Of gold or of gilded silver, it contains some relics of martyrs or other Saints and often a particle of the true Cross. Precious stones frequently decorate it. Popes, bishops, and certain other prelates may wear it everywhere, during liturgical functions or over street clothes.

Our Catholic Faith By Fr. Bob Regan

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

Let's address something of importance right now!

There are people within the St. Rene AND the St. Symphorosa communities who are saying that, as part of Renew My Church, the OTHER parish is closing. There are people within St. Sym's who say St. Rene is closing. And people within St. Rene who claim St. Symphorosa is closing.

My invitation to all of us is to STOP this uninformed neighborhood gossip.

I am personally involved in every step of the Renew My Church process as it pertains to St. Rene and St. Symphorosa, which is also referred to as the 63rd Street Grouping. We began this process late last January when it was first announced our two parishes would begin discernment.

Fr. Idzi is also involved, as are five parishioners from St. Rene, and five parishioners from St. Sym's. We are currently involved in the discernment process. We have formally met twice as a group, and will be meeting again in September to tour each other's campuses and begin more intense discernment. These meetings will continue through late October.

The goal is see how we can best serve the Catholic community of Clearing on the southwest side of Chicago. This is an opportunity to be creative and think how we can best use current structures to continue what the Church has always done – proclaim the good news of salvation, and serve one another in love.

The information and knowledge acquired in these meetings will then be shared with the Archbishop of Chicago, the Renew My Church team, and the Presbyterial

Council. They will use the information provided by St. Rene/St. Sym's to make an informed decision as to how things will look in this area in the near future.

We will be offering numerous scenarios for consideration. Now, in all honesty, is there a chance one of our parishes will close? Yes! Is it likely? No! I don't think that will happen. But the reality right now is that a final decision has NOT been made. So NO ONE from either of our parishes knows the truth. If they do, I would invite them to come see me and share with me how they know the truth of the matter, and I do not yet know it. They can inform me.

Our goal should be to create, in same fashion, a flourishing Catholic community for this area of Chicago. We want to have reverent celebrations of the Mass, quality liturgical music, devotions, altar servers, lay ministers, community outreach, etc, etc. This is difficult to make happen when resources are tight, and we put more money into aging physical plants than we do into evangelization and service.

If Renew My Church is about Christ, and remains about Christ and His Mission, we can look forward to great things in the Catholic Clearing Community. If it is NOT about Christ and His mission, but is instead about personal agendas, guarding territory, and holding onto grudges, then we will suffer as Catholic communities.

Please pray the Renew My Church prayer found in the bulletin. Pray it today and every Sunday until November. Pray that the Holy Spirit INSPIRE us to be the best we can be as Christian disciples on our pilgrim way.

And selfishly, please pray for me.
