Welcome to Two Holy Martyrs Parish!!

St. Symphorosa & St. Rene Goupil

Slowly over the past few years I've noticed more and more a general dissatisfaction in the culture.

In the context of history, we live in the most affluent and comfortable society humankind has ever known.

Information that used to require a trip to the local library is now found with a few clicks on our laptop or cell phone.

The interior of our home or workplace rests comfortably at 72-degrees Fahrenheit. The food we waste could satisfy the tummies of the hungry in third-world nations.

And yet we sense it – a gnawing dissatisfaction; not on occasion, but on a regular basis. It's easy to blame the 24/7 news cycle that wants us perpetually on high alert for the latest tragedy happening somewhere in the country or world. NEWS ALERT. WEATHER ALERT. AMBER ALERT. We risk living in daily fight or flight mode. This is not healthy for the human person.

We need better perspective. Jesus, thankfully, helps us look at things with faith, hope and love. We recognize that, although humanity has been redeemed by the Blood of Jesus, this world -- as it is now -- is NOT HEAVEN, and yet, we carry within our hearts heaven-sized expectations put there by the Creator. We cry out, "things shouldn't be this way." And we'd be correct.

Even the ardent atheist knows evil should "not be." Unfortunately, the atheist shakes his fist in anger at the God he doesn't believe in. Notice, however, deep inside the atheist heart is a sense of how things "should be." And there, in how things should be, the believer and the atheist find common ground.

One day, when Christ comes again in glory, all things will be brought to fulfillment. The perfect world we long for will come to fruition. It isn't fair to point to our imperfections on earth and then dismiss the glory of God in eternal life. Our imperfections shouldn't lead us away from God but should instead reveal to us our need of God's perfecting grace (this is why the Father sent His only-begotten Son).

Please guard against PDS – Perpetual Dissatisfaction Syndrome. What is it? For starters, it is not healthy; our balance gets thrown off and we find ourselves capable only of pointing out everything that is wrong, and taking what is right for granted. We risk finding comfort and/or power only in constant complaining and regular dissatisfaction.

Listen to Jesus. "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full." (John 15; 9-11).

Maybe, just maybe, there is a connection between a culture's dissatisfaction and its relationship with God. We're summoned to more than an occasional wink at God. We're called to surrender our hearts to the Lord, and make Christ the center of our life, the center of our family, the center of our parish, the center of our Church, the center of all we do.

Jesus makes it concise: Love God. Love neighbor. It's not a suggestion. He commands it.

Our Deceased Loved Ones

Every year, the day after All Saints Day, the Church prays for souls of the deceased (All Souls Day, November 2, 2021).

We make intentional time to remember all our loved ones who have died, not just in the past year, but through the decades. Death does not sit well with us, and we all handle death in different ways. It helps to come together and pray with one another, and remembering Christ died on the Cross and rose so that we might follow.

We're reminded of the three stages or levels of mourning the loss of a loved one: tears, silence and song. Tears of sadness come from "losing" someone close to our heart. We cry. It's a temporary loss that, at times, feels forever. While the tears feel like life going out of us, God seeks to fill that empty space with His eternal Love.

Silence is another way we cope. Human words fail to explain what we think or how we feel in the face of death's reality. Where human words fail, God's word provides the hope we need. "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Have faith in God."

Then there is song. Yes, we find ourselves moved to song thanks be to Jesus Christ. Love is stronger than death, and Love is Who died and rose so that we might have life. We sing the song of Resurrection; Alleluia!



“And behold, I [Jesus] am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:20)

With a number of the Collects, the opening prayers for the Masses, the characteristic of timelessness may be detected, whether we are praying to fulfill God’s will, advance in holiness or realize our adoption as His children from the time of our Baptism. The Mass on this Sunday expresses this characteristic of timelessness as well: “Almighty and merciful God, by whose gift your faithful offer you right and praiseworthy service, grant, we pray, that we may hasten without stumbling to receive the things you have promised. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.” (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.) Looking ahead to the end of time, the end of the ages when Christ will return in glory, also known as the eschaton, is a pattern of the Church’s prayer as we near the end of each liturgical year, which also synchronizes with the month of November, our time of explicitly honoring all of the saints and our increased emphasis on prayer for the faithful departed. In just a month, we will conclude one year of grace and begin a new one with the Season of Advent.

At a first reading or hearing, the beginning of the opening prayer for this Sunday might sound a little surprising, that God is allowing us to offer proper worship to Him: “by whose gift your faithful offer you right and praiseworthy service.” A human being expecting praise sounds arrogant and being told that we have received the gift, the privilege, to praise the individual would sound even more insulting and subjugating. With God, though, this is not the case. To respond rightly to God who has created us and gives life to us, we do well to recognize what is the best response and to offer ourselves so that a good relationship with God may develop rather than our becoming detached and isolated from Him. This “right and praiseworthy service,” as the prayer continues, directs us and disposes us to the God who will bless us with good gifts: “that we may hasten without stumbling to receive the things you have promised.” Those who abuse their offices and flex their authority seeking praise and servility do not fulfill such grand promises to their subordinates.

That second portion of the prayer, the petition, “grant, we pray, that we may hasten without stumbling to receive the things you have promised,” is when the timeless characteristic becomes more evident. The Church is praying not so much for an ordinary end, the way a song, book or ballgame concludes, but for a purpose to be fulfilled. Ultimately, of all of “the things you [God] have promised,” the gift of God Himself, in Christ Jesus, the Son of God, who has redeemed us from sin and death and whom we receive in the Most Holy Eucharist; the outpouring of the Holy Spirit into us from the time of our Baptism; in our being welcomed into the life, love and communion of the Holy Trinity; this multifaceted gift is more than any one “thing” in the natural order of this life on earth. “[To] hasten without stumbling to receive” God and to be received by Him is a way of stating how we are responding freely to grace and in a meritorious way with God, what the opening prayers of the Masses from the past several Sundays have proclaimed and reminded us.

The readings for this Mass provide us with a biblical basis for why we can pray as we do this Sunday and of “the things you [God] have promised.” In the First Reading, from the Book of Deuteronomy, St. Moses exhorts his fellow Israelites, “Fear the LORD, your God, and keep, throughout the days of your lives, all his statutes and commandments which I enjoin on you, and thus have long life. Hear then, Israel, and be careful to observe them, that you may grow and prosper the more, in keeping with the promise of the LORD, the God of your fathers, to give you a land flowing with milk and honey.” (Deuteronomy 6:2-3) Although long life on the earth and dwelling in “a land flowing with milk and honey” are gifts promised by God and blessings in themselves, revealing His graciousness and fidelity to His Chosen People, these promises foreshadow eternal life and the Kingdom of Heaven. The Second Reading, taken from the Letter to the Hebrews, specifically speaks of how through Christ we are able to approach the Father: “Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he lives forever to make intercession for them. It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself.” (Hebrews 7:25-27) Even the Gospel Acclamation, when we sing the Alleluia, expresses a belief in God’s promises offered to those who seek Him: “Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord; and my father will love him and we will come to him.” (John 14:23)

Have you recognized God revealing His promises to you and prompting you to seek them? Have you experienced God stimulating you to “hasten without stumbling” toward Him?





ANNUAL REPORT

Two Holy Martyrs Parish Annual Report Summary

It's time to take a look at the parish finances for the 2021 fiscal year, which ended on June 30, 2021. Accordingly, this was the first year of operation for our newly unified parish. As a result, there are no prior years to compare to. However, the impact of the Corona Virus, the unification process, the management of our school during COVID and the operational challenges of two campus locations resulted in the net loss of \$326,460. Please note: the Parish maintains a solid cash position and has managed to progress through the COVID crisis in reasonably good shape. Please read the Annual Report insert in this week's Bulletin. 


