Welcome to Two Holy Martyrs Parish!!

During the Advent season, we sing "O Come, O Come Emmanuel." We also hear "Maranatha!"

These are expressions of anticipation. We're tempted to think these words apply only to the first coming of the Messiah over 2,000 years ago. We must remember, however, that we now await the Second Coming of Jesus. When He comes again it will be in glory. He comes no longer to die but to usher in a new heaven and a new earth.

There are days I find myself praying for the Lord's return. We look at the daily news and wonder, "What is going on?" We see so much senseless violence. We witness an increasing selfishness. The corruption seems to never end. Our politicians appear more concerned about the next election than actually governing for the sake of the common good.

How easily we can slip into discouragement and despair. That's exactly where the Evil One wants us — without hope. Even a casual glance at human history shows us things have always been far from perfect. Why? Because this world is NOT heaven. And yet, we have within our hearts heaven-sized expectations. Love Thy Neighbor

Our parish office occasionally receives calls from neighbors who see something suspicious happening on one or both of our two campuses. We appreciate that folks keep a look out.

We want our parish grounds to be safe places. There should be no illegal activity happening on either campus. No one should be on roof tops. No one should be using unauthorized drugs or inappropriately drinking alcohol on our properties.

However, we do realize neighbors will use our grounds to fly a kite, play with a dog, let a child run around, etc. Although our grounds are private property, we also want to be good neighbors. When I was a young boy, we regularly hung out at our parish parking lot/playground.

If something illegal is taking place on our grounds, don't call the parish office. Call the police. We recommend not directly confronting anyone doing something illegal. The police can sort it out.

Also, if you are a neighbor and have questions or concerns about the parish and our respective properties, please do not confront our maintenance staff while they are working. And certainly, do not use abusive or threatening language (yes, this happens). As pastor, I have quickly learned that some neighbors do not care for our existence as a church. Instead, please call the parish office and ask to speak to the Operations Director, or the Pastor. Thank you!



"And behold, I [Jesus] am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

One sentence, that is how long the Collect, the opening prayer for this Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Times is, apart from the normal one sentence, which concludes the prayer and invokes the Holy Trinity. One sentence and it is substantive prayer: "God of might, giver of every good gift, put into our hearts the love of your name, so that, by deepening our sense of reverence, you may nurture in us what is good and, by your watchful care, keep safe what you have nurtured. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever." (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.)

This prayer begins by addressing God as, "God of might," which occurs with similar words in the Collects for other Masses, such as, "Almighty God." God being mighty is inherent to His being; He is not deficient in any power. Acknowledging Him as, "giver of every good gift," also is ordinary for us to hear. In one prayer after another we petition God for various gifts, such as grace, mercy and love, because all of these gifts come from Him. What we petition God to grant us in the remainder of the prayer is consonant with the almighty God being able to give to us.

The specific request that God "put into our hearts the love of your name," could ring as us being servile before a narcissistic ruler. However, the biblical and hence our Catholic understanding of a name is significantly different than an earthly designation or attempt to curry favor. From the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (2nd ed.), regarding the Second Commandment, we learn, "Among all the words of Revelation, there is one which is unique: the revealed name of God. God confides his name to those who believe in him; he reveals himself to them in his personal mystery. The gift of a name belongs to the order of trust and intimacy. 'The Lord's name is holy.' For this reason man must not abuse it. … Respect for his name is an expression of the respect owed to the mystery of God himself and to the whole sacred reality it evokes." (para. 2143, 2144) Loving God's name is another way for us to express our love for God Himself.

The name of God, what usually is indicated in English as YHWH, though the specific spelling and pronunciation is uncertain, was spoken aloud only one day of the year, Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, by the Jewish High Priest during the offering of a specific sacrifice. This name and other references to God could be in the mind of the Jewish faithful but the name was to be guarded in speech and reference, treated with such caution and reverence, so as to avoid any profaning of it, either from carelessness or even worse, nefarious motives to deceive someone. Thus, in the Collect for this Sunday and in so many of our prayers, we address God as, "God," but without using the divine name. With the incarnation of Jesus, we are able to call Him by the name revealed at His Annunciation and which He will invite His disciples to do as He proclaims the Gospel.

That name, "Jesus," as well as calling upon God as, "God," deserve all reverence, which is what the opening prayer then appeals from God: "deepening our sense of reverence, you may nurture in us what is good." Already we have recognized God as the "giver of every good gift," including the privilege to call upon Him, even in the name of His Son, Jesus, and appropriately we then ask God to increase our reverence for Him and His name that we might be in right relation with Him, humble before Him, and thus be disposed for Him to develop the good gifts, which He has already imparted to us. Knowing our weaknesses and limitations, that we cannot preserve or develop the divine gifts with our earthly power, we conclude the prayer by returning to the "God of might," with the desire that He who gives goods gifts and develops them also would protect these gifts, including ourselves, that neither we nor God's blessings be descerated and lost.

Returning to one particular word in the prayer, "reverence," it is a word, which we are accustomed to hearing. "Reverent," is the final characteristic of the Boy Scout Law. Clergy in the United States and in many countries influenced by Great Britain refer to clergy with the word, "Reverend," with some additional adjectives or adverbs depending on the cleric's position in the Church, such as, "Most Reverend," a formal way of identifying a bishop. Reverence can be a little challenging to define, though. One description of reverence, coming from the late Fr. John Hardon, SJ, in his *Modern Catholic Dictionary* is the following: "The virtue that inclines a person to show honor and respect for persons who possess some dignity."

What of your life do you notice right now as a personal gift from God? What do you revere?





FEAST OF FAITH

WHAT JESUS DID, WHAT JESUS SAID

The oldest account of what happened at the Last Supper comes to us not from the Gospels but from the First Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians: "I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me' " (11:23–24).

In our celebrations of the Eucharist, we are obedient to Christ's command to "do this." The priest, acting in the person of Christ, does what Jesus did and says what Jesus said. He takes bread, gives thanks, breaks it, and gives it to the Lord's disciples. He takes wine, gives thanks, shares it with us. We believe that the entire Eucharistic Prayer is consecratory, but we continue to hold these words of Jesus in special reverence. They are called the words of consecration, and the elevations of the host and chalice, the genuflections of the priest, and the optional ringing of a bell and use of incense remind us that we are in the presence of the Lord.

Sowing Seeds in Our Garden

The poor you will always have with you.

These are Jesus' words in the twenty-sixth chapter of Matthew's Gospel.

This reminds me of something the late Francis Cardinal George said at a gala fundraising event. His Eminence challenged those present by saying, "The poor need the rich to stay out of poverty. The rich need the poor to stay out of hell."

Yikes! I would love to have seen the faces on those present.

Basically, as Christian disciples, we do have an obligation to be attentive to those with needs. Notice the word is needs, not wants. There are those who struggle to have life's basics: food, shelter, clothing.

One way we can help those in need is by supporting our parish's St. Vincent de Paul Society. We have parishioners who volunteer to serve those in need right here in our community. SVdP raises money so that when a local family/person needs some short-term assistance, we're there to help as best we can.


