

Fr. Bob's Weekly Blog



Either it is true or it is not true.

What? The Resurrection; first off Jesus rose from the dead, and then, when all things are brought to fulfillment at the end of time, those who hold the hand of Christ as a means to salvation.

Interestingly we live in a society that thinks there can be two truths – one truth for you and another truth for others. This is called Relativism. Relativism is the doctrine that knowledge, truth, and morality exist in relation to culture, society or historical context, and are not absolute.

Very few folks would dispute that 2 + 2 equals 4. Pretty objective. However, in the realm of morality and faith-claims we wade in murkier waters. Here's an example. One person says, "God exists," while the person across the debate table claims, "God does not exist."

Can both statements be true? There is both God and not God.

One of the dogmatic teachings of our Christian faith is the truth of the death and resurrection of Jesus from the dead. This is either true or it is not true. If Jesus of Nazareth literally suffered, died, rose and ascended, then He is truly King of kings and Lord of lords. We bow down toward such Truth.

However, if Jesus died, but the resurrection did not happen, then our faith is built upon a lie, and we'd best pursue some other truth.

This is why each one of us at some point has to personally profess our faith. We have to say "I believe."

There are those people who will say, "There is no way some dead person rose from the dead." To this we say, "Were you there?" No, they weren't,

so we have to base all this on authority.

If I get lost on my way to Wyoming and decide to pull off the road and buy a map, I have to trust the authors of the purchased map. I will assume the map has the correct road markers to get me where I need to go. I don't personally know the map maker, but I trust that following this map will help me reach my destination. (Do you trust Google Maps?)

So who is the authority behind the truth claim of Jesus rose from the dead, or Jesus did not rise from the dead? Good question. And who is the authority behind the truth claim God exists, or God does not exist? Inquiring minds want to know. But in the end, there can be only one truth.

For us as Catholic Christians, the authority is the 2,000-plus year history of the Church. God has given us a map to follow. God is the ultimate Authority. We are free to accept this, to guess on our own, to make up our own claims, or to reject the map. None of that changes the truth. God is, or God is not. Jesus rose or Jesus did not.

The last paragraph of today's second reading gives us food for thought.

It reads, "We are confident of you in the Lord that what we instruct you, you are doing and will continue to do. May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the endurance of Christ."

And the second half of our Gospel points to a future resurrection; that those who are children of God will rise. We have our life in God. This is our faith.

We are free to ascent to it, or to reject it.

The Enemy is doing its best to pull us all out of relationship with God; and in the process to tear us apart – to divide us by any means necessary. Reject it. Direct

your heart to the love of God. Accept His love for you. Trust in the Lord. Delight in the Lord. Be still in the Lord.

Let the truth be what it is.

Where are we right now in the Renew My Church process?

Good question! Here's where we are:

The discernment teams from both St. Rene and St. Symphorosa are currently finalizing a report that will be presented on December 18th, 2019. The two groups have spent the past few months looking at the spiritual and physical realities of both parishes. They've poured over a lot of factual information while also talking about the emotional and faith challenges we face as we give our advice to those who represent the Archdiocese of Chicago Renew My Church team.

This is a good time to personally thank the parishioners from both St. Rene and St. Symphorosa who have given to this discernment phase a lot of their own personal time. These parishioners are not being paid, but have said "yes" because they care, and caring goes a long way to making decisions based on more than economic realities.

Those who have given of their time and talent for St. Rene Parish are: Ben Shafer, Julie Wojcik, John Strompolis, Carole & Mark Dill, and Charlie Murphy. They each have years of service to St. Rene, and they have done their best to help a good decision to be made.

Once members of both teams (along with their respective pastor) present on Dec. 18 our proposal to members of the Archdiocesan RMC Team, we will await a January decision from the Archbishop of Chicago. The Cardinal will receive plenty of information and advisement prior to the final decision.

Here is a reminder of what three scenarios were on the table: Scenario #1 - St. Symphorosa and St. Rene will merge to form one new parish. The school will be at the St. Sym's site. Scenario #2 - St. Symphorosa Church and School will close and the parish/school will be located at the current St. Rene campus. Scenario #3 - St. Rene Parish will close and parish/school will be located at the St. Symphorosa campus.

The only scenario that is not a reality is that we do nothing. Doing nothing is not on the table.

We live in a heavily Catholic area of the city. This is a great opportunity for us to truly embrace renewal.


This is not some new gimmick or marketing campaign. It is about MISSION, but we have to have a stable, safe, economically sensible infrastructure to DO MISSION -- the mission is to make disciples, build communities, and inspire witness.

If we make this truly about Jesus, and trust in the power of the Holy Spirit, we'll see some amazing things happen as we prepare for the next 25-30 years. If we make this about ourselves, and buildings and territory, we may as well set the time clock of our demise. Our choices and attitudes will matter

Jesus is not going to inspect our buildings at the end of time. He will look into our hearts. What will he find?

Please pray during these next couple months that the Holy Spirit touch hearts, inspire minds, and unite us as ONE people in Christ.




