Welcome to Two Holy Martyrs Parish!!

St. Symphorosa & St. Rene Goupil

We're only a few weeks into Autumn in Chicago but allow me to summon for a moment the flavor of the three days leading up to Easter; the days we refer to as the Triduum.

During this trio of days, the tangible reality of Jesus's suffering and death smacks us in the liturgical face as we realize (sometimes through our tears) that Jesus shed blood for our sins; not just the collective sin of humanity, but your personal sins and my personal sins.

Our guilt creeps up from the subconscious to the forefront as the musician at the pipe organ softly plays O Sacred Head Surrounded. We're sorry and we're thankful at the same time. Yes, we have sinned. Yes, Jesus died for them, and has invited us to follow him through the Cross to the glory of New Life. Do we trust him? Will we follow him even as the cross rises into sight?

The Lord, on three distinct occasions, told his Apostles that he must go to Jerusalem, where he must suffer and be killed before he would rise. Were those early disciples listening to him? Or did they occupy themselves with self-referential statements about "Who is the greatest among them?" or "Can we sit at your side in the Kingdom?"

Christ wants them to see the reality of the Cross first, but they tend to overlook what he's saying as they set their sights on eternal life.

This kind of talk about suffering and the cross is foolishness to many people in our world today. Please note, we do not wish for suffering. We do not wish for death. However, when suffering and/or death do come our way, we have holy context for it, thanks be to Jesus.

Here are words to meditate on from St. John Paul II:

"There is no evil to be faced that Christ does not face with us. There is not enemy that Christ has not already conquered. There is no cross to bear that Christ has not already borne for us, and does not now bear with us. And on the far side of every cross we find the newness of life in the Holy Spirit, that new life which will reach its fulfillment in the Resurrection. This is our faith. This is our witness before the world."

St. Symphorosa, pray for us. St. Rene Goupil, pray for us.

We will have a "Last Mass," down the road to honor his years of service to the Catholic Church. He played elsewhere before arriving in the Clearing area of Chicago.

I am not ashamed to say there will be tears in my eyes as I process out to the Recessional Hymn for his last Mass with us. Thank you, Steve!

We have begun a search for a new music director. We welcome any interested and competent applicants. The first step for an interested musician is to send us a resume and give us a phone call. We'll go from there.

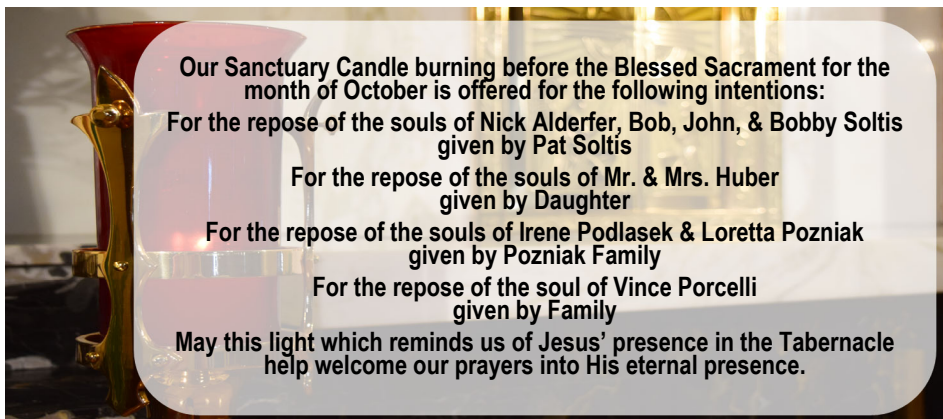

“And behold, I [Jesus] am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:20)

Similar to the brevity of the Collect, the opening prayer of the Mass, for last Sunday, the Church prays concisely this Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time: “Almighty ever-living God, grant that we may always conform our will to yours and serve your majesty in sincerity of heart. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.” (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.) Again, as with the opening prayer from last Sunday, this Collect is direct and “ordinary,” nothing unusually spectacular about it. Pausing for a few moments, though, with what the Church petitions in this prayer, we have the opportunity to be refreshed with some of the fundamentals of our life and faith.

Beginning with the words, “grant that we may always conform our will to yours,” the human will is central to what we are asking God to conform of us. The human will is part of our nature, our being human, in contrast to other parts of creation: “The human person participates in the light and power of the divine Spirit. By his reason, he is capable of understanding the order of things established by the Creator. By free will, he is capable of directing himself toward his true good. He finds his perfection ‘in seeking and loving what is true and good.’” (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, para. 1704) Our will, from which we choose to act, is free to cooperate with or resist God, as we acknowledge in the prayer.

The Holy See elaborates the role of the human will in our choices and actions. Providing both clarity and reassurance to us regarding our reason, will and the passions or feelings, which we experience, we are told, “It belongs to the perfection of the moral or human good that the passions be governed by reason. Strong feelings are not decisive for the morality or the holiness of persons; they are simply the inexhaustible reservoir of images and affections in which the moral life is expressed. Passions are morally good when they contribute to a good action, evil in the opposite case. The upright will orders the movements of the senses it appropriates to the good and to beatitude; an evil will succumbs to disordered passions and exacerbates them.” (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, para. 1767-1768) Experiencing a particular feeling or active passion is not automatically a virtuous or sinful act, rather, these passions or feelings are innate to our being. They may contribute to a good or evil action depending upon how our reason evaluates them and how we choose to act in response to them at the movement of our will. Applied to the opening prayer, do we choose to conform our will to God’s will, do we choose to serve His majesty and do so with sincere hearts?

Reminding ourselves of the presence and role of our reason, will and passions is not just a random lesson for this Sunday but a way to recognize the reason and will of God, which are constantly active yet revealed to us in several ways in the readings for this Sunday. In the First Reading, the Prophet Isaiah reveals, “If he [the servant of God] gives his life as an offering for sin, he shall see his descendants in a long life, and the will of the LORD shall be accomplished through him.” (Isaiah 53:10) This prophecy alludes to Christ, who will fulfill these redemptive works in the course of His life, knowing that they apply to Him (use of reason) and freely choosing to accomplish them in His Passion and Death (use of will). In the Responsorial Psalm, the author, on behalf of his fellow Jews and by extension us as well, asks of God, “May your kindness, O LORD, be upon us who have put our hope in you.” (Psalm 33:22) Reason allows the Psalmist to realize the Lord’s “kindness” and by the exercise of the will we may “put our hope in you [God].”

Then, in the Second Reading, the author of the Letter to the Hebrews attests that Jesus really has assumed our human nature to Himself, the Son of God, and thus, “we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin. So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help.” (Hebrews 4:15-16) Being fully human as well as fully divine, Jesus also has human reason and a human will; when He offers His life on the Cross, our Lord is conforming His human reason and will to that of that of divine reason and will and is doing so the free exercise of His human will. The author of this letter proceeds to exhort his fellow Christians, perhaps by stirring a feeling of confidence, to realize their access to the mercy and grace of God (use of their reason) and to seek these divine gifts (use of their will).

Does this description of human will, reason and our passions or feelings help you to understand our life in God and the life of Christ?

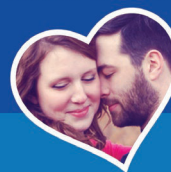

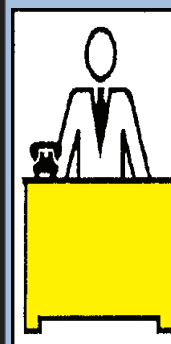
