

Fr. Bob's Weekly Blog



"Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every joint with which it is supplied, when each part is working properly, makes bodily growth and upbuilds itself in love." Ephesians 15: 15-16

Seeing the world through the lens of our Christian faith helps us to recognize the inherent human dignity in each and every human life. No exceptions; from womb to tomb.

With this in mind, we enter fully into the month of October, which for the Church is Respect Life Month.

This is not just about abortion. Respect life is vital to a humane, civil society. Unfortunately, there are those who think we can discard the whole notion of God and still respect life. Maybe for a while, but eventually we grow more distant from each other as we grow more distant from the One True God.

When we look at another human being – even someone who might be our worst enemy – we must recognize in that person the Imago Dei – that they have been created in the image and likeness of God; even if that person doesn't believe it. Although we may have a disagreement and might not ever share a meal together, we would never do intentional harm to his or her person (neither physically, emotionally or spiritually).

The Imago Dei is not state sanctioned. The inherent human dignity we are called to respect comes not from the government but from God. Life is precious for a reason; because it is a great gift. Life is also fragile.

Think of it this way. Without a doubt, most folks today would agree chattel slavery is WRONG; that it is an assault on the person's human dignity. So far so good. But why is chattel slavery wrong? Is it wrong only because a governing body says it is

wrong? Or is it wrong because we appeal to a Higher Authority than any earthly power?

Because if it's wrong based solely on human governing (man-made law), then you could establish a governing power that simply changes the law. So morality would be based solely on who is in power

In the Judea-Christian view, which transcends legal and illegal, it is about God's love and God's law. Something (like chattel slavery) is not wrong because we say it's wrong. It's wrong because it is objectively wrong in all circumstances and at all times, and we must surrender to this Higher Love.

We as Christian disciples must stand strong on the issue of respecting life. We must avoid playing political games with such an important issue. Our current society is slipping more and more into dehumanization. No coincidence that this increasing dehumanization is tied to our declining faith life. When folks are assaulted over an iPhone, we've tipped the scale to treating people like objects. We are not objects. We are human beings; made in the image and likeness of God, and called to live our lives from this objective truth.

The scandal of the Holocaust was that a certain group of people were dehumanized. And once you can dehumanize a person (even the unborn) you can then discard them at your convenience; treat them as less than human.

A government declaring something legal never makes it right, just as a government declaring something illegal doesn't make it wrong. Right and wrong transcend us, and if the day comes when we no longer believe this, then watch out, because only those in power will decide, and it's far too often the powerless pay the price.

Respect life! Why? God wills it.

Retreat Time

This coming week I will be away from the parish on a five-day silent retreat. This retreat is part of a spiritual direction training program I've been part of for the past three years. It is vital that a priest take this time each year to get silent and still. We are all at risk of becoming too busy and losing sight of what our faith is really about, and this is especially true for priests and religious sisters and brothers.

This spiritual direction program will reach its completion in February 2020, and I will officially be certified as a spiritual director.

The Health Benefits of Singing At Mass

Singing has long been a part of our tradition - we are a religion of song. Singing in church is a form of prayer. Music is a way to worship God. We all know the expression given to us by St. Augustine: "He who sings, prays twice." But singing is more essential to our spiritual lives than we often believe. Singing the Psalms shows us a way to praise God: "Come let us sing joyfully to the Lord."



But there are even more reasons that can be derived from singing at Mass:

Singing for Heart Health



A Swedish study found that singing improves heart function, essentially by forcing us to take larger, slower, more purposeful breaths. The study found that choral singers had slower respiration, which in turn improved their heart rate variability, and had a biologically soothing effect on overall heart function.

Singing to Boost Immunity

Another study claims that singing can improve immune function and the body's ability to lower stress and fight off disease. The study showed decreased cortisol levels (stress hormone) in patients who'd recently sang.

Singing As a Workout

Singing can be an excellent form of exercise. Even if you're healthy, your lungs will get a workout as you employ proper singing techniques and vocal projections. You will develop a stronger diaphragm and stimulated overall circulation. Since you pull in a greater amount of oxygen while singing than when doing many other types of exercise, some even believe that singing can increase your aerobic capacity and stamina.



God gave us the gift of music and song. Join us in embracing and enjoying it. *God is not concerned about the quality of your voice, He is looking at the condition of your heart.* So, the next time you're singing in church, don't just mouth the words while your mind wanders. Think about the words you're singing. Think about who you're singing to. Think about who you're singing about.

Our Catholic Faith By Fr. Bob Regan

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

One of the bestselling business/leadership/motivation books of all time is Steven Covey's *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People*. First published in 1989, the book has become classic in this genre. Since the original, there have been a few spin-offs, including *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens*.

Here are Covey's original habits: 1. Be Proactive. 2. Begin with the end in mind. 3. Put first things first. 4. Think win-win. 5. Seek first to understand, then to be understood. 6. Synergize. 7. Sharpen the saw; Growth.

A habit is a routine behavior that is repeated regularly; and tends to occur subconsciously after having been ingrained. As we know from our own life experience, there are good habits and bad habits.

As Christian disciples, our life is spent eliminating bad habits and embracing one's that elevate our soul. Did Jesus give us anything that could help with all this? He most certainly did.

Here are The 7 Habits of Highly Reflective Catholics: 1. Baptism. 2. Eucharist. 3. Confirmation. 4. Reconciliation. 5. Anointing of the Sick. 6. Matrimony. 7. Holy Orders.

Do these sound familiar? Well, these are the seven sacraments of the Holy Catholic Church. They have been instituted by Christ for our spiritual health; to give us supernatural life. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church

teaches, "Christ now acts through the sacraments he instituted to communicate his grace. The sacraments are perceptible signs (words and actions) accessible to our human nature."

In other words, God makes something invisible (grace) available to us through visible means (water, words, bread, oil, etc). The sacraments are NOT MAGIC, but they are a great mystery. And if you study the origin of the word sacrament, you will trace it back to the Greek word mysterion (yup, mystery).

The more we avail ourselves with proper disposition and faith to the sacraments, the healthier our soul. We also find ourselves strengthened to live out our faith in daily life. We must not take the sacraments for granted, nor can we ignore them and think there will not be spiritual consequences. Jesus never meant for any one of the sacraments to be a burden to us, but instead, that they be lifegiving for us. To distance ourselves from the sacraments is to distance ourselves from a great gift.

Peter Kreeft wrote, "Sacraments are like hoses. They are the channels of the living water of God's grace. Our faith is like opening the faucet. We can open it a lot, a little, or not at all."

Well said, Professor Kreeft. May we as Christian disciples keep that faucet open ... A LOT.


