Fr. Bob's Weekly Blog

Welcome to Two Holy Martyrs Parish!!

Jesus often used exaggeration to make a point. Case in point -- “And if your hand or foot causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it from you.” Um, please, in this instance, don’t take the Lord, literally. We want you using your hands and feet to manifest the kingdom of God on earth.

Exaggeration is still a good way, however, to get people to think through the issues of the day.

There is a growing number of people who think the world would be a better place if religion would go away. That is a very bold statement to make, and one that is a tad general. Is the deeper issue really religion? Or might the issue be more related to the human person and the human heart?

Let’s imagine we eradicated all religion. The state has stepped in and banned Christianity, Judaism, Islam, etc.. There can be no worship of God and no houses of worship. In the wake of this edict, will we suddenly experience a world at peace? Will Cubs fans and White Sox fans suddenly gather together and sing “Take Me Out to the Ballgame?” I wonder!

Sadly, there will be more than a handful of folks who answer “yes,” that the world will be better off without religion. Religion is the problem. No religion equals a better world. Ahh, if only things were so simple and we could just point over there at THEM, and eliminate THEM, we’d finally have world peace.

Please take time and ponder this quote by Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn. He wrote, “If only it were all so simple. If only there were evil people somewhere insidiously committing evil deeds, and it were necessary only to separate them from the rest of us and destroy them. But the line dividing good and evil cuts through

the heart of every human being. And who is willing to destroy a piece of his own heart?”

Far too often our self-righteous pointed finger is a placating of our own guilty conscience in some other area of our personal life. Example: a husband who regularly beats his wife also volunteers at a soup kitchen and likes to preach to anyone who will listen, “We need to do something about world hunger.”

Well, he’s right about addressing world hunger, but we can see how his moral concern pointed in another direction keeps him feeling good about himself all the while his wife continues to live in fear of the next incident. Maybe Mr. Slap Happy needs to take a look inside his own troubled heart.

Jesus talked about this when he said, “Why do you see the speck that is in your brother’s eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?”

One of the roots of the word religion is the Latin “*religare*,” which means to bind, or to connect. Authentic religion should connect the human with the divine, and in turn, connect us to one another. This is why the Father sent His only-begotten Son – to be the mediator; to restore what had been lost. Sadly, religion, can be hijacked and used for nefarious purposes (This is not God’s fault. We choose to use freewill to do evil). The mis-use of religion, however, does not cancel out the goal of authentic religion, which is UNION WITH GOD.

We are capable of great good, but also of horrific evil. So much depends on the inner stirrings of our respective hearts, and who or what we have made God (or a god) that is NOT God. We do well to unite our human hearts with the Sacred Heart

of Jesus. God’s grace working in and through us helps to manifest the kingdom of God on earth. Blaming authentic religion is not the answer to our complex societal problems. It’s scapegoating!

So, Fr. Bob, what, then, is the way?

The Lord told us when He said, “I am the way, and the truth, and the life.”

And that is no exaggeration.



Domine, labia mea aperies (Lord, you will open my lips) (Psalm 51:17)

The Collect in our Mass for the Third Sunday of Easter models a certain characteristic, which runs through the Catholic faith and is expressed in the Liturgy, namely, a looking to the past and to the future while in the present. The text of the prayer is as follows: “May your people exult for ever, O God, in renewed youthfulness of spirit, so that, rejoicing now in the restored glory of our adoption, we may look forward in confident hope to the rejoicing of the day of resurrection.” (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.) Although we continue to rejoice in the Season of Easter, we are not yet rejoicing in the resurrected life of Heaven. Our joy is rooted in Christ’s Resurrection from the dead (the past) and liberating us from the bonds of sin, though the temptation to sin persists in our lives (the present), we still await the coming day of Jesus’ Second Coming and our resurrected life with Him (the future). Put another way, we are in that mysterious and at time perplexing state of “already” and “not yet.”

Consistent with the Collect in our Mass, the Collect for the Latin Mass also looks to the past and the present, with hints at the burgeoning future, in light of our faith: “O God, who to those that go astray dost show the light of Thy truth, that they may return to the past of justice: grant that all who are enrolled in the Christian faith, may both spurn all that is hostile to that name, and follow after what is fitting to it.” (Translation, *The Daily Missal and Liturgical Manual*, Baronius Press, Ltd. 2007) From past sins, the Church petitions God that we “may return to the past of justice” (the present) and then, rejecting evil, “follow after what is fitting to it [God’s name]” (the future).

References to the past, present and future are also evident in the Mass prayed by Catholics from the Anglican liturgical tradition. In the Collect for this Mass, the Church prays, “Almighty God, who hast given thine only Son to be unto us both a sacrifice for sin, and also an example of godly life: give us grace that we may always most thankfully receive his inestimable benefit; and also daily endeavour ourselves to follow the blessed steps of his most holy life.” (*Divine Worship: The Missal*) Christ as the “sacrifice for sin” (the past) continues to be made present in the Holy Eucharist. Moreover, in this prayer, the recognition of conscientious discipleship is explicit: “daily endeavour ourselves to follow the blessed steps of his most holy life” (the present) and a looking forward, “that we may always most thankfully receive his inestimable benefit.”

We pray for those who risk their lives while fighting fundamental rights under dictatorships, authoritarian regimes and even in democracies in crisis.






