Welcome to Two Holy Martyrs Parish!!

He ascended into heaven. Huh?

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. In the wake of the Resurrection, Jesus appeared to His disciples over the course of forty days. He then left them at His Ascension the commission to proclaim the good news.

What's so good about this news?

We, mere humans, thanks be to God, are invited to follow Jesus through the cross into the glory of eternal life. We do NOT get there on our own power. The Lord has paved the way via the Paschal Mystery (Suffering, Death, Resurrection and Ascension). We take hold of his nail-marked salvific hand and hold on for dear life.

Saint Augustine wrote, "Out of compassion for us He descended from heaven and although He ascended alone, we also ascend, because we are in Him by grace."

This is the GOOD NEWS. Although we await the day of fulfillment, we can already unite our earthly heart with the heavenly heart of our Savior who now serves as mediator between us and the Father.

Sadly, for many different reasons, people have chosen to reject the good news. The limiting of the Christian story to mere morality is one reason. People are not inspired by a list of "do this and not that." We, at times, lose sight of what the transformative power of the Gospel is supposed to do – lift us toward the divine. In technical theological language this is known as Divinization (also Deification or Theosis).

St. Irenaeus beautifully expressed this elevation of the human toward the divine when he wrote, "This is why the Word became man, and the Son of God, Son of man: so that man, by entering into communion with the Word and thus receiving divine sonship, might become a son (daughter) of God."

Our reaction to the Good News should be "Wow!" and not a yawn or indifference. We've allowed the despairing news of this world to shout over the Christian proclamation of ALLELUIA! We have a love story to tell. We must tell this story but also LIVE this story as we go about our day. We can experience the joy of the risen Lord now but our joy will be complete when Christ makes all things new.

Popular media wants us to believe more and more people don't believe in God. I don't believe this is true. Certainly, people are turning away from "organized

religion," but that does not mean they don't believe in God. Jesus didn't give us "organized religion." He gave us His life. The core of our faith is not an idea, event or ideology. The center of our faith is a Person, and from the Person of Jesus, the Christ, we receive a Church that serves as an ark amidst the tumultuous waves of this world.

Organized religion didn't suffer, die, rise and ascend. Jesus did. He is Lord. He gives us His Body & Blood at every single Mass. May our hearts never experience the cold of indifference to so great a gift.

Ordination Anniversaries

This is the time of year when most Archdiocese of Chicago priests celebrate their respective anniversary of ordination.

Please take a moment to wish Fr. Matt and Fr. Norm a happy anniversary. As priests we truly believe we have been called to serve the Lord in this way. Ordination is not a right. The three of us take this responsibility seriously and do our best to teach, preach, and govern in the name of Jesus.

This year my anniversary (May 16, 2015) falls on the Sunday we celebrate the Ascension. Thanks be to Jesus.

Also, we want to honor the diaconate ordinations of Deacon Tom Hyde and Deacon Raul Duque. All the best!



“And behold, I [Jesus] am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:20)

On this Sunday, we will pray the Mass of the Ascension of the Lord. Traditionally, this Mass, remembering our Lord’s Ascension from earth back to the Father, was fixed on the fortieth day of Easter. During the past several decades, some dioceses, including the Archdiocese of Chicago, have transferred the celebration of this solemnity to the following Sunday, the Seventh Sunday of Easter. If you use a daily missal or a monthly devotional guide for the Mass, such as Magnificat, then you might have seen this description in the introduction for the Ascension. As with a few other solemnities, the Church provides us with two options for the Collect, the opening prayer. The first one reads as follows: “Gladden us with holy joys, almighty God, and make us rejoice with devout thanksgiving, for the Ascension of Christ your Son is our exaltation, and, where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope.” (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.)

The second option is slightly shorter and almost verbatim with the Collect prayed in the Latin Mass and in the Mass of the Anglican Ordinariate (Catholics of Anglican heritage now in union with the Catholic Church). This second option for the opening prayer in our Mass is as follows: “Grant, we pray, almighty God, that we, who believe that your Only Begotten Son, our Redeemer, ascended this day to the heavens, may in spirit dwell already in heavenly realms.” (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.)

Both prayers explicitly reference Jesus’ Ascension as well as the desire that we would also participate with our Lord in heavenly life. A difference in the prayers is one of emphasis. The first option seems to unite elements from the end of St. Matthew’s, St. Mark’s and St. Luke’s Gospels. This year, we will hear St. Mark’s account of Jesus’ Ascension and are told that “the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs.” (Mark 16:20) The Head (Jesus) remains attached to His Body (the Church), which is manifested by the works of the Lord, which the disciples accomplish. From St. Matthew’s conclusion, our Lord promises, “I am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:20) Here, too, the Head and Body are not separated and the grace of hope is nourished in the Apostles. St. Luke concludes his Gospel with an additional description of the disciples, that they “returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God.” (Luke 24:53) Notice, the Church, in the first option for the Collect, asks that God also “Gladden us with holy joys, ..., and make us rejoice with devout thanksgiving,” in other words, to make us like the disciples who saw Jesus ascend into Heaven.

We can detect the influence of St. Luke in the second option. The Acts of the Apostles are attributed to St. Luke along with one of the Gospels. In his account of Jesus’ Resurrection, St. Luke describes, “two men in dazzling garments” who appear and speak to the myrrh-bearing women, revealing, “Why do you seek the living one among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised.” (Luke 24:4, 5-6) Again, in the Acts of the Apostles, what we hear in the First Reading for this Sunday, St. Luke reports that to the Apostles, “suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They [the two men] said, ‘Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.’” (Acts 1:10-11)

The “two men” likely are angels and both at Jesus’ tomb and at His Ascension, they explain why the myrrh-bearing women, the Apostles and we have reason to hope: that Jesus has risen from the dead and that despite no longer seeing Him He has not abandoned us. By our union with Christ in Baptism, we are being drawn to Him; by our praying of the Liturgy, we pray with the Lord and thus “may in spirit dwell already in heavenly realms.”

The death of loved ones can feel like absolute separation and a cause for mourning. Does Jesus’ Ascension, His promises and the reaction of the Apostles who witness the Ascension influence how you view your own beloved dead?




