This weekend we welcome to our parish Fr. Richard, who is this year's mission speaker.

Every year each parish throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago hosts a mission speaker. Doing this helps remind us that the Church we belong to is much larger than the building at 64<sup>th</sup> St. and New England Ave, much larger than just the Archdiocese of Chicago.

The word catholic means universal. Our Christian faith encompasses the four corners of the world. Within the Church there are many languages, many cultures, many skin tones, but only one Lord, who is Jesus Christ. Jesus gives us the Church as a means of salvation.

## **Busy Being Busy**

"There is need of only one thing." Those are the words of Jesus in today's Gospel.

Only one? Please, Lord. Do tell!

In the great, grand scheme of things, the most important necessary thing in life is our proximity to Christ – how close we are to His Sacred Heart.

Think of how easy it is to get so busy we no longer have time to pray; or to attend to those things that nurture our soul. On our currency, it says "In God We Trust" but this could easily be changed today to "Go! Go! Go!"

We strive to find a healthy balance in our lives, but even within church ministry, we can easily slip into being busy for the sake of being busy. Busy-ness is often a mask for deeper spiritual ills. We stay busy because we don't want to get still or quiet and actually have to think about something we're consciously or subconsciously avoiding. Better to keep super busy.

Jesus reminds us today that when all is said and done, the thing that matters most is, in reality, not a thing, but a person – the second person of the Trinity. It is time spent with him that fuels our life. Martha was anxious. Things had to get done. Mary was simply resting at the feet of the Lord.

There is a saying, "Got everything done. Died anyway."

That saying, and this weekend's Gospel, should help put things in perspective for us. Our time on earth is limited. Our lives have purpose and meaning, only because we have a Creator, and we do well to keep an eternal view of things as we go about our daily life.

As Thomas Merton so insightfully wrote, "Anxiety is a sign of spiritual insecurity." We're anxious because we are not sure if we truly believe in what God has promised.

If we truly believe Jesus died and rose from the dead, and He promised eternal life to those who accept his sacrifice of love, we need not spend one minute anxious about what's going to happen.

We already know the end of the story. Light triumphs over darkness. Amen!

## **Our Catholic Faith**

“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age.” Matthew 28:19-20

Joy is the infallible sign of the presence of God.

Those are the words of Christian theologian Pierre Teilhard de Chardin. And those words reveal one of the good fruits of the Holy Spirit – JOY.

One of Chicago’s retired auxiliary bishops is Raymond Goedert. He’s been around for quite some time. He’s actually one of the survivors of the Andrea Doria shipwreck. He’s lived quite a life as a priest in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

When he presides at a Confirmation, he usually has a stock homily he uses, in which he introduces the young children to the word joy. He then tells them his stand for Jesus, Others, and You. Bishop Goedert gives them an ordering to their life, and now, to our life as well.

J = Jesus is first. Number One. O = love means willing the good of the other. When the love of Christ drives our life, we concern ourselves with the well-being of others. Y = You are important, after all, you are made in the image and likeness of God.

This somewhat folksy play on letters actually makes a lot of sense to a Christian disciple, which is what we are, or aspire to be.

When the presence of God disappears from one’s life – or from one’s home, or parish, or church or society, the inevitable result is sadness (not sorrow). Far too many people today actually believe society would be better off if we dismissed the whole God thing. I vehemently disagree.

We need God. God does not need us. Only human pride and arrogance can actually say the human person is better off without God.

Think of it this way – materially we are subject to the Law of Gravity. We defy it at risk to our physical life. Spiritually, we are subject to the Law of Love (God). We defy it at risk to our soul.

Slapping a fake smile on our face amidst real internal pain and suffering is no substitute for the fruit of joy that emerges from being in a life-giving, soul-enriching relationship with the Lord. We can fake a smile. We can’t fake joy.

And joy is the infallible sign of the presence of God. Jesus. Others. You.

If you leave Jesus out, and put yourself first, all you are left with is “YO!”



## St. Mary Magdalene—July 22



Mary Magdalene was one of Christ's disciples. She has been identified with several Marys in the Gospel: Mary, the sister of Martha and Lazarus; Mary, the sinner who washed Jesus' feet with her tears; Mary, a woman who cared for Jesus and his apostles on their journey. Today scholars believe that Mary Magdalene was not the sinful woman in Scripture although she has been confused with this unnamed woman for centuries.

So Mary Magdalene was near Jesus in his darkest hour and again in his most glorious hour. Moreover, she was an outstanding disciple of Jesus. Because Mary Magdalene was the one who brought the news of Jesus' resurrection to the apostles, she is called the Apostle to the Apostles. For centuries St. Mary Magdalene has been considered a model of complete generosity and of sincere sorrow for sin.


