

Welcome to Two Holy Martyrs Parish!!

St. Symphorosa & St. Rene Goupil

Back in the late 1950s and throughout the 1960s, my dad was Formation of Hearts the varsity football coach at Morton West High School in Berwyn. Once a week, he and the assistant coaches would gather to watch game film from the previous week's game.

The goal was to review the team's performance; to see what went well, and what needed improvement. Were the right decisions being made? Did the players block properly? Was there a player or two out of position?

All of this game-film review helped the coaches and players get better each week of the season.

In the spiritual life, too, we are called to regularly pause from live action and take a look at what's been going on in our life. We can look back on the previous day before retiring for the night. This is called The Examen.

We review the previous day and basically ask ourselves (with the Holy Spirit's guidance) where was I in relation to God the past 24 hours? Where was I living hand-in-hand with Jesus as I went about my day? Where did I let go of his hand? What were the moments where I want to give thanks to God? What were the occasions when I distanced myself from Love and need to ask forgiveness?

Doing The Examen every evening helps us in our life of discipleship. Jesus desires for us to be more than churchgoers and rigid rules followers. Our going to Mass and adhering to the tenets of the faith flow from our being intentional disciples of the Lord. We participate in Mass because we want to worship God and, in return, be sanctified as we go back out into the world. The "rules" of the faith are in place because God has put them there for the good of humankind.

Rules without relationship leads to rebellion. If we do not have a good relationship with Christ, we usually end up resenting "the rules." But if we seek union with the Lord, we see he has given us precepts so that we can be elevated in our humanity.

Not every child understands why mom and dad have certain expectations. In a healthy family, it is because the parents love their child and don't want the child to get in harm's way. Hmmm! Imagine God having the same expectations for His children on Earth.

Consider taking 5-10 minutes each evening to review your day. Consider it "watching game film." Don't just look at the "bad stuff." That's part of it. Be sure to make time for gratitude as we give thanks to God. This spiritual practice helps us to mature in our discipleship and become more loving instruments of God's grace in this world and we prepare ourselves for Eternal Life.

And when the time comes to "render an account" of your life, it won't be the first time you watched "game film."

Autumn has arrived and soon we'll step outside in the morning to that first pinch of cool weather (go back inside for a sweater). This time of year is beautiful. We experience the colors of the season and sip warmer drinks.

Our children are also back in school.

Here in the parish, we have children who attend our school (St. Symphorosa School) and children who go to school elsewhere but are active in our Faith Formation program (Religious Education).

While these students open their minds to learn new things, we also want them to open their hearts to being formed. Education is more than mere digestion of facts. Education is an engagement of mind and heart so that what we learn helps us to become a good person.

The philosopher Aristotle wrote, "Educating the mind without educating the heart is no education at all."

How true, Mr. Philosopher!

We want this for our children, but I would add a challenge for us as the adults. We, too, keep on educating ourselves. We never stop learning. We, too, engage our minds and our hearts as Christian parents and adults.

One of my big concerns early this school year is how some parents have chosen to engage with our school staff. There needs to be a certain decorum for coming in to express concerns with a teacher and/or the principal.

We recently had a parent who came in and unleashed a stream of profanity directed at a staff member; a parent demanding this and demanding that. This is NEVER acceptable behavior from any of our parents or from our staff.

Unfortunate things will happen in an elementary school environment. Children between ages 6 and 14 aren't properly behaved 24-7 (either at home or at school). We want to do our best to look at what may have happened with honesty and integrity. Children sometimes say and do mean things. Adults sometimes say and do mean things. We want to do our best to handle tough situations with class and respect.

Shouting vulgar profanity and creating hysteria will not be how we handle business in our school or in our parish. Leave that for the Maury Povich show. Might we be upset about something? Yes! We can express this in a mature manner that takes into consideration all parties involved.

We would never tolerate a teacher shouting profanities at a parent. This is a twoway street of respect for parents and teachers. Thank you!

"And behold, I [Jesus] am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

"May your grace, O Lord, we pray, at all times go before us and follow after and make us always determined to carry out good works. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever." (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.) These are the words of the Collect, the opening prayer, of the Mass for this Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time. When initially read or heard, this prayer can seem rather plain. It is concise, God's grace is always important and of course, we are always to do good works; nothing in this prayer is innovative, at least not recently so.

As a quick refresher, "Grace is favor, the free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to his call to become children of God, adoptive sons, partakers of the divine nature and of eternal life. Grace is a participation in the life of God. It introduces us into the intimacy of Trinitarian life: by Baptism the Christian participates in

the grace of Christ, the Head of his Body. As an 'adopted son' he can henceforth call God 'Father,' in union with the only Son. He receives the life of the Spirit who breathes charity into him and who forms the Church." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, para. 1996-1997) Grace is analogous to food, water and air in that these natural goods are necessary for our body's well-being while grace is necessary for our soul's well-being. Understandably, we cannot follow God without God and His gifts, in particular, the different graces: those which initiate us as His daughters and sons, those which heal and strengthen the soul, those of our vocation and those for persevering in following Christ through ordinary life. (cf. *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, para. 2000, 2001, 2003)

With this description of grace in mind, we might better appreciate the opening prayer, grace going before us so that we may discern God's will among the good works, which are possible for us to do, and then attempt to pursue these good works. Even after seemingly completing a good work, grace follows after us and disposes us to remain humble and appreciative to God of any success, which we experience. Grace also enables us to resist despondence over any failures while still fostering a readiness to good reforms in future efforts. Grace, thus, going before us and following after us is essential accomplishing good works with God and in God.

That grace effects us and our relationship with God in the above ways is subtly present in the Gospel Reading. Dialoguing first with the wealthy man and then with His disciples, Jesus indicates the necessity of grace for those who would follow Him. First, our Lord challenges the wealthy man who expresses zeal "to inherit eternal life," to sell all that has and give the proceeds to poor. (Mark 10:17, 21) In the face of that challenge, we hear that the man's "face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions." (Mark10:22) Grace, not just willpower or emotional satisfaction, is necessary for this man to respond affirmatively to Jesus' invitation to Him.

Later in this same reading, Jesus emphasizes, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!", and then reiterates, "The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, 'Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." (Mark 10:23-25) Stunned, the disciples respond, "Then who can be saved?", to which Jesus answers, "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God. All things are possible for God." (Mark 10:26, 27) In this exchange, as well as the first one, the impossibly high threshold for entering the Kingdom of God, for being "saved," is clarified. Humans cannot gain eternal life by their gumption and good works alone; God and His gifts of grace are vital for this supernatural fulfillment.

When you encounter situations in life, which seem impossible to complete, namely, doing a good work, or to avoid, namely, resisting a bad habit or temptation, do you ask God for His grace? Have you ever noticed God's grace present and aiding you as you encountered such situations?

Want to get involved? Want to help others grow in their faith? Want to grow your faith? SPRED may just be what you are looking for.

SPRED (Special Religious Development) is a program which trains and guides parishes to provide faith formation to persons with developmental disabilities and/or learning problems and become integrated into parish life. St. Rene has had a SPRED group for more than 30 years and St. Symphorosa has had a SPRED group for 20 years. Now that our two churches have become one parish, our SPRED ministry has doubled. The need for this ministry is great. And the need for volunteers is great.

In 1978 I became a parishioner of St. Rene Goupil parish. I was already a Spred catechist in another parish working with people living in a State residential facility called The Elisabeth Ludeman Developmental Center in Park Forest. Sometime in 2004 or a little later, I became involved in Spred at St. Rene with adults who lived at home with

their families. It was so special to host a Sunday or Saturday regular parish Mass with our Spred community and other Spred groups from the area two or three times a year. This helped us to give witness to our faith as Spred catechists and our friends and families. What is unique about the Spred ministry is that the catechists come together every other week to support one another on our faith journey growing in relationship with one another and with the Lord of life. On alternate weeks we welcome our friends with intellectual and developmental disabilities and accompany them on their faith journey. Spred has been a real gift to my faith life. I continue to be a Spred catechist at the Archdiocesan Spred Center on Lowe Avenue with adolescents, 11 to 16 years of age, and with catechists who enjoy being with one another as we deepen our faith which is a life long experience.


