

Fr. Bob's Weekly Blog



Rules without relationship lead to rebellion. Relationship without rules leads to chaos.

Perhaps you've heard the aforementioned parenting adage before, but these wise words certainly pertain to our faith.

God sent his only-begotten Son into the world to redeem the human race and to restore an intimate relationship once severed in the Garden of Eden. Grace is now available to us and we are invited into a covenantal relationship with God the Father.

As part of this relationship, there are "rules of the road" as we continue our pilgrimage through this world. Please note that the relationship is primary to the secondary rules. God's love for us and our reception of His love and our return of His love takes precedence.

Sadly, there are those who only see our faith as being "all about the rules." They miss the primary relationship.

The rules (God's teaching for humanity) flow from God's love for us. God desires what is best for us – both individually and as a human race. Chicago Bears legendary founder George Halas used to say, "Behind every good rule is a good reason." Hmmm!

There are those folks who would then insist that God is soooooo loving that it doesn't matter what we do. This is a deception. What we do or fail to do also matters. Relationship without rules leads to chaos. Freedom in Christ does not mean we can do whatever we want. That's not freedom. That's called license. There is a difference.

Freedom involves doing what we OUGHT to do; what we SHOULD do, and the guiding star of our freedom is Jesus the Christ; the One who is the way, and the truth, and the life; the One who says to each of us, "Follow me!"

The Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes are given to us by the Lord for a reason; a good reason, which is love. Let's use this analogy: loving parents establish house rules for their children out of love and concern for their wellbeing. And so does our God for His children.

We need the relationship, and we need the "rules," which help us stay on the path that leads to holiness and happiness. When we accept the Lord's offer of relationship, it changes how we live our life. We are to align our will with God's will out of love.

Knowing Our Faith

Holy Mass is the daily/weekly pinnacle of our Catholic faith. The Eucharist is the Source and Summit. However, intentional disciples of the Lord want to consistently deepen their understanding of the faith. What are some ways this can be done?

Personally I recommend owning or borrowing the DVD series "Catholicism" produced by Word on Fire and narrated by Bishop Robert Barron. This is a professionally produced and beautiful exploration of our faith tradition. Sit back and enjoy the series.

Also, every Catholic home should have within its walls the Holy Bible, a book on the saints, and the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Once they are on the book shelf, make it a point to take them off the book shelf and explore them. Do a little reading every day (or minimally, once a week).

There are numerous websites and YouTube videos that help us know our faith better. Fr. Mike Schmitz offers some relevant videos on YouTube that normally run between five and ten minutes.

Of course, there are always books. If you asked what spiritual classic is a "must read," the answer would be St. Augustine's *Confessions*, but there are thousands of quality books whose purpose is to lead us closer to God. A good question to ask when you pick up a book is, "Does this author want me to grow closer to God?"

In this day and age, it is essential we have a better understanding of our faith. We want to engage the heart AND THE MIND, and there are some amazing resources out there today to help us.

We are life-long learners in general, but even more so when it comes to our Catholic faith.

Our Catholic Faith By Fr. Bob Regan

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

Just a few weeks ago there was an interesting survey making its way through the news cycle. The results of the survey revealed the varying length of sermons in different Christian denominations. Of course, the Catholic Church got lumped in with the denominations. This didn't make any sense to me because we have a totally different approach to preaching on the Word of God, and we are not a denomination.

In the Catholic Mass, there is a homily, not a sermon. Is there a difference, Fr. Bob? Yes!

Ideally, the homily takes us from having heard the Word of God and points us toward the Eucharist. The homily is not meant to be a prolonged dissertation on biblical exegesis. The homily should have something to do with the scripture we just heard in the readings, and it should direct our minds and hearts to worthy reception of the Blessed Sacrament, and inspire us to go back into the world on mission.

In the survey, some of our Christian brothers and sisters listen to an hour-long sermon. These denominations often refer to themselves as Bible-based, or say "We are people of the Book."

In contrast, Catholics would say, "We are people of the Word." We do not limit our faith to just the physical book that we call the Bible. We embrace Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, and we have been care-takers of the Holy Bible for over 2,000 years.

Where do you think the Bible came from? Did Jesus hand out bibles to each of his Apostles right before He ascended into heaven? No! The Canon of Sacred Scripture emerged from the Church. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the Church discerned the books that would make up the Bible we know today.

There is a time and place for extended preaching, but in our view, the Mass is not that place. The survey reported that Catholic Church had the shortest sermons. The survey made no attempt to explain the different approach between Christian denominations and the Catholic Church.

The homily should NEVER be unnecessarily long. Sure, occasionally the priest or deacon may need to spend some more time with a homily, but a homily should range between five and fifteen minutes. The star of the Mass is NOT the preacher, it is the Eucharist; it is Christ present in the Sacrament of Love.

Back in my seminary days, one of the professors of Sacred Scripture would often challenge the newly ordained deacons about their respective homilies. He'd be half joking but half serious when he'd say, "What could you possibly say that Scripture has not already said?"


