Fr. Bob's Weekly Blog



Perspective has been a word on my mind a lot over the past few months.

One of the basic dictionary definitions of the word is "a particular attitude toward or way of regarding something; a point of view."

When a person lacks perspective, there is often confusion. Jesus helps bring perspective to our lives, and we as Christian disciples begin to view the world through a sacramental lens. Suffering, pain, and death are given context in the shadow of the Cross of Christ.

During the summer I spent as a chaplain at Loyola Hospital in Maywood, one of my fellow chaplains, a Presbyterian, regularly came back to our team room very depressed at all the pain and suffering she just witnessed as she spent time with patients in their respective hospital rooms.

Her theological lens didn't allow for pain or suffering. It made no sense to her. She just wanted it to NOT BE. Reality, however, presents us daily with many examples of pain and suffering in this world. And yet, deep in our hearts, we agree to some extent with my former chaplain mate. Pain and suffering should NOT BE. We can imagine a world without it, and this should force us to ask, "Where does that notion of a pain-free, suffering-free world come from?"

Friends, we live in the "already but not yet" of salvation history. Already? This means God took on human flesh in the person of Jesus and underwent His Passion so as to REDEEM the human race. Jesus' suffering, death, resurrection and ascension are the "already." Not yet?

Well, we await the fulfillment of all things at the end of time when Christ comes again in glory.

Because of the "not yet," we still experience the effects of the Fall and Original Sin. Life in this broken, wounded world is not a bed of roses. Notice, however, that as you travel up the stem of a rose, you encounter some thorns. Such is life. We do not discard the truth of the beautiful rose petals just because we have encountered a thorn or two or three along the way.

Spending time in front of a crucifix goes a long way in allowing us to share our earthly pain and suffering with Jesus. He walked it before us and showed us that pain and suffering are not forever. We need not fear the thorns of life when we're promised an eternal Rose. We must keep all things in perspective in times of desolation (life's low points).

After all, the reason we so love a 72-degree sunny day is because we've lived through the cold dreary cloudiness of winter. Hope springs eternal.

May this time of trial and tribulation help us sharpen our perspective, especially our faith perspective. See the world through the crucified and risen lens of the Lord. Don't miss the beauty amidst the thorns.

Never underestimate how the Enemy of God and the Enemy of human nature will seek to use earthly events as an opportunity to create mayhem.

Be assured the Serpent is slithering into many minds today to sow fear, despair, doubt and confusion. The main goal? As always is its main goal ... to pull us out of relationship with God and out of relationship with one another.

Look at how we humans begin to react in times of fear. We kind of lose our minds, because we've likely already lost our hearts. We planted our hopes and dreams purely in this world and have forgotten the bigger picture. So when times get tough, we lose our sense of perspective, and we risk lashing out at those around us.

Be attentive to the needs of others. Watch out for slipping into selfishness. And most of all? Stay centered on Christ. Pray. Pray. Pray. Our Catholic Faith By Fr. Bob Regan

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

"When somebody can write something better than you can, let his words step to the forefront. What follows below was written by Bishop Fulton Sheen, and he gives us food for thought when we encounter sin within the walls of the institutional church.

Scandalized by Sin by Fulton J. Sheen

"The psychology of those who are scandalized by bad Catholics is interesting. It means that they expected something better; if people who themselves are wicked, rejoice in the scandal, it is because they think they have greater authority for sinning than anyone else who fell. One never hears it said: "He is a bad Relativist," or he is a "scandalous Humanist" or an "adulterous Ethicist," because they never really expected anything better from them in the beginning.

"The horror that one feels at those who fall, is the measure of the height of virtue to which they expected to stand. We are grateful for the compliment of their being scandalized at our weak members, and for being intolerant with us about the very things they tolerate in others. They know that there are no other new lights possible if the sun fails!

"It is intellectually stultifying and morally easy to be a Communist; it is intellectually refreshing and morally hard to be a Catholic. No ideal is more difficult of attainment. When anyone falls away from a Sun Cult he never has very far to tumble. But when a Catholic falls away, he is apt to be far worse than anyone else. The greater the height from which he falls, the greater the splash. "The corruption of the best is the worst. No flowers smell worse than the rotted lily.

May we ask those who are scandalized with the failings of the Church, how perfect the Church would have to be before they would become incorporated into it as a living cell? If it were as perfect as they wanted it to be, do they realize that there would be no room for them? Just suppose for a moment, that Christ's Mystical Body had no moral weaknesses; suppose that no monk ever broke his priestly vows to marry a nun and start a new religion – and this really happened; suppose that no bishop was ever just a business administrator and no priest ever disedifying and no monk ever fat, and no sister ever cross to her children, and sanctity was as automatic as a parking meter; and suppose no one ever gave scandal to those who are on the outside to justify the way they were living.

"Would such a Church be the kind that our Lord envisaged, Who told us that cockle would be sowed with wheat, and that some of the children of the kingdom would be cast out? If the Mystical Body were as perfect as the scandalized would have it, would not Her very perfection accuse and condemn us who are not saintly? Too high an ideal often repels rather than attracts.

"She would be so saintly that She would no longer allure ordinary mortals. She might even appear to the struggling souls as terribly Puritan, easily scandalized at our failings, and might even shrink from having her garments touched by sinners like ourselves. Gone then would be the hope for those who are unholy and in sin. No! The Mystical Body with none but perfect members would be a stumbling block. Then, instead of us being scandalized by Her, She would be scandalized by us, which would be far worse."





Faith Formation Classes


Classes for Grades 1-8 are offered on Wednesday evenings from 6:00-7:30pm.




