Welcome to Lent 2020; here we go!

Wasn't it just Christmas? Seems like it for sure, but this weekend we begin our annual penitential season.

Think of it as spiritual Spring Training. Each spring baseball players (many of whom have been playing baseball since they were young children) show up and return to the basic fundamentals of the game — field the ball, hit the ball, run the

We, too, as committed Christian disciples, show up and return to the basics of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Many of us use Lent as a time to address an area of our life that has grown lax. We sometimes say things like, "I want to do a better job this Lent of ..." Fill in the blank.

Let me offer a slight twist for Lent. Instead of what we are DOING, let's get focused on our BEING. Who are we becoming as human persons? We run the risk of turning Lent into more stuff WE have to get done, instead of allowing Jesus to do some interior cleansing in our hearts.

Those of you who regularly hear my homilies know I often refer to the heart. In biblical language, the heart is the core of our person; our being. And what is going on inside us matters ... big time! Lent is a season to allow purification to take place, and we must open ourselves up to what God desires to give us. We must yearn to receive from God, who longs to simply love you where you are, but also lead you to places you can't get on your own power.

The Enemy (the murderer and father of lies) wants nothing more than to

foment doubt and confusion. Our first reading this weekend from Genesis reminds us of the sly serpent's tactics. This Enemy seeks to sever our relationship with God and with one another. Who do you think is behind so much of the chaos in the world? I know. I know. This murderer and father of lies also has plenty of human cooperation; those he has succeeded in convincing God is our competitor and we, too, if we so desire, can be like gods.

Lent is a time to check our deepest desires. What do you long for? Go beyond your wants and needs. What is your deepest desire? And who or what can satisfy that hunger? That thirst?

Many people think Lent is a time to go searching for God again, but the reality of it all is that it is a time to allow God to find us where we are (be honest about where you are right now) and let him show us -- more clearly than ever -- the way and the truth and the life.

Mission Mission

We are encouraged to attend this year's 2020 Lenten Mission hosted by St. Symphorosa.

The three-day Mission will take place March 2, 3 & 4 and begin each evening at 7 PM inside St. Symphorosa's main church. I have been invited to be the Mission speaker this year, and I am certainly honored to spend some time with the Lord and with each other, as we open our minds and hearts to God's amazing grace.

The Tuesday, March 3rd session, will include time for celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please take advantage of the healing grace made available in Confession. Whether it's been one month

or 20 years since your last confession, the Lord awaits your sorrowful contrition (I'm sorry) so as to give you His beautiful mercy.

Expressing Gratitude

Occasionally we just need to say THANK YOU! Who do you mean, Fr. Bob? Let's start with YOU reading this bulletin right now. Thank you for being a part of St. Rene, or for joining us this weekend. You are here to worship and to be sanctified. Together, we say thanks!

Also, thank you to so many who do the little "this" and "thats" around our parish. No Catholic parish should ever become dependent on one person. So many of you care about your spiritual home. I've experienced it, even when it comes across as a little too concerned.





The **rules** for **fasting** and abstinence in the United States are: Every person 18 years or older must abstain from meat (and items made with meat) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. Every person between the age of 18 and 59 (beginning of 60th year) must **fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Our Catholic Faith By Fr. Bob Regan

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

This week we will once again present a Question & Answer format in the Our Catholic Faith section of the bulletin as an informative update in the Renew My Church process that involves St. Rene Goupil and St. Symphorosa uniting to form a new parish.

Question #1 – Will this unification of the two parishes with two worship sites affect the current Mass times?

Answer – Yes! Between the two parishes right now, we have a total of eight (8) Masses – four Masses at each parish. We can anticipate a re-structuring of Mass number and Mass time. This will be discussed by parish leadership in the coming months. Nothing has been decided at this point.

Because there will be occasions when ONE priest needs to cover ALL the Masses on a given weekend, he will need to be able to commute between the two locations (8 minute drive legally, 5 minutes illegally). We cannot have two Masses at the same time, and must allow for breathing space between the Masses.

We realize everyone has their "preferred" Mass time, and that any change to a Mass schedule causes frustration. We also have to live with realistic parameters that are for the good of the whole, not just some parts.

My dream would be that in five years, we need eight Masses again because on Sundays the pews are filled to capacity; that so many people rediscover the beauty of the Mass and realize the supernatural power of the Eucharist. Jesus didn't give us the Mass to make us feel burdened by a Sunday obligation. The Lord gave us the Eucharist as PURE GIFT to nourish our soul. And we come to say "Thank You!"

Question #2 – Will the newly-formed parish have a new name?

Answer – Yes! But what the new name is will be open for input in the coming months, and might not be decided until AFTER July 1, 2020. The option to simply combine the two parish names into one -- St. Symphorosa/St. Rene -- is certainly one possibility, although quite a mouthful to say.

Another option is to introduce an entirely new name. A recent example took place at St. Jane de Chantel. With the closure of St. Camillus and their joining of St. Jane, the newly-formed parish decided on St. Faustina.

Please note: Regardless of the official parish name change, the two campus sites will retain their original name. The parish location at 64th and New England will be the St. Rene campus. The parish location at 62nd and Austin will be the St. Symphorosa campus. If a funeral home were to call the parish office to schedule a funeral Mass, we'd ask them, "At which location?" And the family would mention either the St. Rene campus or the St. Sym's campus, but the overall parish herself could have a new name. Stay tuned!

Question #3 – Why is there a vocation issue in the Church today?

Answer – Because there is a faith issue in our society. No doubt God still calls men and women to specific religious vocations, and there are some dynamic young folks hearing the call today and answering the call. The inspiring story of the Franciscans of the Eucharist is a perfect example of what can happen.

This religious order accepted the challenge to move into the old Our Lady of the Angels property at Hamlin Ave. and Iowa St. in the Garfield Park area. This is the site of the tragic school fire in the 1950's. Today it is the home for Fr. Bob Lombardo, 10 nuns (all under 40) and a religious brother. They do wonderful ministry in a tough area of the city.

More specifically, we need good, faith-filled young men to not only hear the call to the priesthood but to actually discern the call, and if truly called by God, to answer this call. Also, young men and women discerning a call need the love and support of their respective families and their parishes.

We can do much more in our parish to foster vocations and to support vocations, but this begins by praying for specific men and women to hear God's call amidst so much societal noise and distraction.

Vocations begin AT HOME!






