

Welcome to Two Holy Martyrs Parish!!

St. Symphorosa & St. Rene Goupil

Many of you have your favorite hymns. These are those church songs you easily sing because, for some reason, it stirs your soul. I'm pretty sure if I asked you right now to name your favorite hymn, you could tell me. You might even toss in two or three more because you can't choose just one.

One of my favorites is "At That First Eucharist." (Breaking Bread #366) The melody is fine, but as I mature spiritually, the words mean more and more to me. What we sing in this hymn is worth knowing, and remember, a hymn is (or should be) sung prayer.

This weekend the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Jesus – what used to be called Corpus Christi. We are grateful for the gift of the Eucharist. The Lord instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper, along with instituting the Priesthood. He gives us through His Church all that we need to grow closer to Him and to grow closer to one another. Bodily (Church) division is never from the Holy Spirit.

Allow me to highlight just a few lines from the aforementioned hymn:

Lord, who at Thy first Eucharist did pray, that all Thy Church might be forever one. Jesus said "Remain in me." We are called to surrender to the One who is the way, and the truth and the life. He is the ONLY one who truly unites us into one love, which is God's love. The enemy of God and of human beings is the dark spirit who seeks to create disunity, ultimately to tear us apart. The Eucharist unites us. There is a reason we call our reception of the Body and Blood of Jesus by the word Communion.

For all Thy Church O Lord, we intercede, make thou our sad divisions soon to cease. Divisions within the Church are nothing new. St. Paul wrote many letters to various places where divisions had arisen. It is easy to get divided when Jesus is no longer the number one priority, or when we seek to twist Jesus' words to align more with a personal agenda. I can't help but point out the elephant in the room today. Personal politics have become for far too many folks more important than our faith. At my very first Mass after ordination, I asked in my homily, "Does your faith form your politics, or do your politics form your faith?" That's a fair question. The Eucharist helps us reprioritize what matters in the end.

We pray thee, too, for wanderers from thy fold. O bring them back, Good Shepherd of the sheep. My hunch says none of us needs to go very far to find someone who was "raised Catholic" who is today adrift from the faith, away from the pews, missing from the Mystical Body of Christ. There are a host of reasons people have "walked away." Often at the head of the list is the sex abuse crisis. This shook people to the core, and still does. Allow me to just say this for now. None of that behavior is "of Christ." Our response shouldn't be to "walk away" but to lean in even more and help to purify Mother Church. We cannot allow the sins of our brothers and sisters to distance us from the truth of the Paschal Mystery. The scourge of child sexual abuse finds itself in every corner of our world (families, sports organizations, Hollywood, the wealthy politically connected). That, however, is no excuse for it to exist in the Church, especially in the priesthood and religious life.

So Lord, at length when sacraments shall cease, may we be one with all Thy Church above. One with thy saints in one unbroken peace. One with thy saints in one unbounded love; More blessed still in peace and love to be, One with the Trinity in Unity. These are some very beautiful, hope-filled words about the destination of those who have surrendered into the saving arms of the crucified and risen Lord. This world we live in now is NOT our home. We are pilgrims on a journey. Our citizenship is in heaven. The sacraments the Lord gives us through the Church are avenues of grace to aid us in our sanctification, and to help us manifest the kingdom of heaven on earth. The ways of the world care more about being HIP. The way of a disciple cares more

about being HOLY. There are those who scream, "The Church needs to conform to the world." Wrong! The Church needs to go <u>OUT</u> to the world and Christify the world. We bring the Good News to the poor, the oppressed, the downtrodden, the sick, the lonely, etc.. Jesus came to set the captives free, and far too many people today have been enslaved by the ways of the world. The Truth sets us free, and Jesus said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life." He gives us everything we need – including the Eucharist – to reach the final destination, which is communion in the eternal life of the Holy Trinity.

Neighbors In the Know

For the past year, there has been a LOT of activity on our St. Rene campus. Initially we had a host of water pipe issues that involved some big trucks working on site. Concrete had to be dug up and underground pipes fixed and re-aligned. This always draws the attention of nearby neighbors who start to wonder "What's going on?"

More recently, we have been emptying out the Rene campus school building of excess clutter as well as doing the same thing in the Rene campus rectory/house. Think about this. The St. Rene rectory building is set up for ONE priest to live there. We have three priests, and priests normally live in community. There is no way Fr. Matt, Fr. Norm and I could fit in the current set-up at Rene. That factored into deciding where the priests would reside.

Now, the Rene rectory is 60 years old. Over time things accumulate. We needed to go through everything and decide what stays, what gets donated and what gets tossed. We have had numerous dumpsters on the Rene campus to help with de-cluttering. We want to be able to use the house for other purposes. We can have meetings in that house, a guest could stay there, or some other purpose.

This came to light again because a neighbor talked to our Operations Director this past week and said his neighbor told him that the grass lot and the vacant rectory is/will be sold. I guess I was not in the meeting that the other neighbor was in about the sale of the property.

I am not naïve. I know we all like to speculate at times about what we think is going on. That's part of how we are as human beings. However, when it comes to moving this parish forward, and doing our best to create a win-win scenario, I will face these kinds of rumors head on.

As of Sunday, June 6, 2021, there has not been ONE meeting to talk about selling the grass lot or the St. Rene Rectory building. This is mere neighborhood speculation. Someone might say, "But Father, we don't know what's going on?" That's because nothing is going on other than taking care of some maintenance issues on the St. Rene campus and getting things cleaned up and de-cluttered for future use.

As we near the first week of July, I will release a "State of the Parish" letter. This will remind us where we've been, where we are now, and where we'd like to go. But right now, our focus is on continuing to grow closer to Christ, unify the people, to beautify our churches/campuses, make sure both campuses are safe and up-to-code, increase our parish school enrollment (current fall enrollment is 220 students), celebrate reverent and joy-filled liturgy, get social events going again (including Bingo), and help people Re-discover Sunday. I am excited about all this and invite everyone, including our neighbors, to not write pre-mature obituaries for our parish. Allow the Holy Spirit and the witness of the

first Apostles to show us what can be done with faith the size of a mustard seed.

St. Symphorosa, pray for us! St. Rene Goupil, pray for us.



May this light which reminds us of Jesus' presence in the Tabernacle help welcome our prayers into His eternal presence.

"And behold, I [Jesus] am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20)

Near the beginning of the Mass on this Sunday, the Church will pray, "O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption. Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever." (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.) A peculiar feature of this Collect, this opening prayer for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) is that it is addressed to Jesus, to God the Son. Often, but not always, the opening prayer is directed to the God the Father as indicated by the frequent conclusion,

"Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever." (*Roman Missal*, 3rd ed.) With particular attention to the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist and Christ's presence in this sacrament, the opening prayer understandably speaks more to the Son yet preserves the unity of the Holy Trinity.

Fittingly, on this first Sunday after Trinity Sunday, a subtle Trinitarian dimension is present. In the Second Reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, the author writes about what the Holy Trinity is doing to effect our salvation: "how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God." (Hebrews 9:14) Christ offers Himself on the Cross and makes Himself present in the Most Holy Eucharist. In addition, we are told that the Holy Spirit, though not dying on the Cross, is at work with Jesus as He does offer Himself. And to whom does Jesus make this sacrifice, God the Father.

Returning to the opening prayer, do you recall ever experiencing "the fruits of your redemption" and if so, what were they? The Second Reading identifies two such fruits with the first being to "cleanse our consciences from dead works" and while the second fruit is "to worship the living God." When you receive Holy Communion, how do you respond to the Holy Trinity, how do you pray?



JESUS' SACRIFICE AND OURS

In presenting the still-familiar four-fold "Shape of the Eucharist"—Jesus takes / blesses / breaks / gives (Mark 14:22)—Mark omits Matthew's specification of purpose "for the forgiveness of sins," and Luke's "for the remembrance of me." But Jesus does recall the covenant, Israel's liberation from Egypt's slavery. And could the disciples—or we—fail to recall that, in Mark's earliest verses, Jesus sits at table "with tax collectors and those known as sinners" (2:15)? Mark also emphasizes the Eucharist as our participation in Jesus' passion and pledge of our share in his future glory. Jesus had earlier referred to his disciples' suffering as "drinking from the cup he would drink" (10:38–39). Soon he would beg his Abba to "take this cup away" (14:36). But while sharing the Eucharistic cup, Jesus promises a day when he would "drink it new" (14:25): the cup of suffering and sorrow is not the last cup he—or we—will drink. The cup of the Garden of Agony will be transformed into the cup of the Kingdom of God.

Through both scripture and tradition, Jesus' Eucharistic self-giving challenges us who partake so frequently of the Eucharist (or hope to do so again once the pandemic is past) to become a community of self-sacrificing love that both worships Christ's presence in the Blessed Sacrament and serves Christ's presence in others. In his Apostolic Exhortation, *The Joy of the Gospel (Evangelii Gaudium)*, Pope Francis praises the presence, in so many communities, of groups devoted to prayer and intercession, prayerful reading of God's Word, and perpetual adoration of the Eucharist. But then Francis repeats Saint John Paul II's warning that such personal devotion must never become a privatized, individualistic spirituality that forgets the demands of charity or the implications of Jesus' incarnation (*EG*, 262). As we receive Jesus' body sacramentally in the Eucharist, so we should touch Jesus' flesh compassionately in the suffering flesh of others (*EG*, 270).
