THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Today's Gospel reading begins a long section unique to Luke's Gospel. Jesus begins his journey to Jerusalem, which will end with his ministry in Jerusalem. We read that Jesus' days for being "taken up" were fulfilled. The Greek word that Luke uses for "taken up" is the same word he uses to describe the Ascension. We also read that Jesus is determined to journey to Jerusalem. For Luke, Jesus' ministry begins in Galilee and then is one long journey to Jerusalem. In Jerusalem, he will meet his death but also enter into his glory. Only in Luke does Jesus then spend 40 days in Jerusalem instructing his disciples. It is in Jerusalem that his disciples wait after his Ascension to be sent the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. And it is from Jerusalem, in Luke's second volume, the Acts of the Apostles, that the Good News is spread to Rome and the ends of the earth.

We have readings about discipleship today. What does it mean to follow Jesus Christ? Perhaps for many people, following the Lord meant keeping the rules of the Church and being careful to avoid sin. While there is nothing wrong with keeping the rules of the Church and avoiding sin, this is surely not a complete description of

following the Lord.

In the New Testament, over and over, we find that we must remain with the Lord because He remains with us. We are called to walk with Him and to listen to Him and to allow His teaching and His words to form the way we think, the way we feel and the way we act. Following the Lord Jesus means allowing Him to change every aspect of our lives so that we more clearly reflect His way of living, of thinking and of being. Following someone else is not easy.

The first reading today comes from the First Book of Kings. Elisha realizes that he must follow Elijah and be his disciple. Elijah does not encourage him, but Elisha follows anyway. We must realize that following the Lord Jesus means that at times we will feel rejected, even by the Lord Himself. We must keep on walking and letting the Lord form us.

In the passage of the Gospel today we have people coming to Jesus who want to follow Him. Again, the message is given to them: it is not easy to follow the Lord. Again, this is important for us when we feel the difficulties of following the Lord

Jesus. He tells us in advance: it will not be easy. The Gospel today ends telling us that if we start out, we should continue, no matter how difficult it is.

Through faith and the Sacrament of Baptism, we Catholics who have become members of the Body of Christ, have also become servants and slaves of Jesus. As Elisha accepted to live a holy life by submitting himself to the Divine Will of God without hesitation, we Catholics are also called to be holy by standing firm and not submitting ourselves to the yoke of slavery. For Christ has set us free from the yoke of slavery.

In true discipleship, there is no turning back. There is no turning back to the worldly ways. As slaves of Christ, we are expected to continuously move forward by growing in our spiritual lives through the grace of God, the Father, and the sanctifying power of the Holy Spirit in the Most Holy Name of Jesus.

As we start this process to Renew My Church, I wanted to take a moment and inform the entire parish of the representatives chosen to be on St. Symphorosa's discernment team. These individuals have taken on the responsibility to be our parish's voice through out this process. They have a hard and long task ahead of them that requires not only countless hours of time, traveling to and from meetings, but also the mental and spiritual strength that comes with such a task.

The process of choosing our delegates was not taken lightly by myself and I wanted to be sure to chose those members who I feel would be the best voice for St. Symphorosa. It was asked that I remember to chose members of our parish and school who are not only active parishioners in a spiritual sense but also in a physical sense. I, as the pastor, was told that these individuals must have a vast knowledge of the history and people of our parish along with a want for a stronger and better future. These individuals had to be ones who are able and willing to work together with others. According to the regulations for the Renew My Church process each parish is allowed 5 representatives, 6 if their is still an active, open school within the parish.

Out of the 6 individuals needed for this process two were required to be myself and our School Principal, **Mrs. Kathy Berry**. **Mr. Luis Cornejo** has agreed to represent our school parents and students as well as our parish. On our team we also have **Mr. Tom DeRose** as a representative of the parish organizations, **Mr. Ken Hilliard**, our Director of Operations for his knowledge of the parish buildings and financials, and **Ms. Monica Wodke**, our Transformation Team Leader.

Please pray for all of us as we began and move through this discernment process. Pray for our parish and for St. Rene that we may work together to strengthen both of our parishes through Renew My Church. Thank you.


