

# TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus, in today's Gospel, recommends only one method: keep praying! Persist in your prayer! Don't give up! Insist that God answer you!

Most of us give up far too easily when we ask for things from others. We accept a negative answer and believe that we can do nothing more. In prayer, if God does not give us what we are asking for almost immediately, we presume that His answer is "no" or that God simply does not care.

If we look at the history of prayers, the history of saints who pray, we find that many saints prayed for decades before finally being given what they had prayed for. Even though today's Gospel insists that God will be quicker than the unjust judge, we also know that if we continue to ask for something, God continues to listen.

This is strong medicine for us. We must base our prayer on a belief in God and a belief that God is active in our world. If we have those two beliefs at the very foundation of our life, then we can persist in prayer with the help of God's mercy. We must pester God and keep on insisting that God give us what we need. In this struggle with God, our faith can deepen and our daily awareness of God's love,

compassion and mercy can grow incredibly.

God wants us to be like the persistent widow, staying in relationship with God, confident that God hears and answers prayers. Then Jesus laments, "Will such faith be found when the Son of Man comes?" In this lament, Jesus notes how easy it can be for us to lose heart.

Our divine Lord teaches us, in this parable, the need for perseverance in prayer. This perseverance develops our trust and confidence in God. It helps us to become humble and to realize how weak we are when left to ourselves. It keeps us close to God, as we learn how dependent we are on His generosity. If we only would realize that God is perhaps never closer to us than when we think He is forgetting us! The trials of life, spiritual or temporal, which He allows us to suffer are not obstacles to our spiritual progress but rather stepping-stones without which we could not cross the rivers of life at all.

How many of us can save ourselves without Jesus Christ? None of us! How many of us have friends who can assure our salvation? None of us! We all need Jesus Christ! Therefore, to obtain our salvation,



we must persevere in our living faith, in our adoration of God, in our love towards others, in our righteousness, in our obedience to God, in our servitude, in our humility, all of these being the food that feeds our souls to assure our salvation through Jesus Christ.

Let us ask today for the Holy Spirit to be in our hearts and our minds, strengthening us for the struggle and giving us this necessary persistence. Let us give thanks for God's love for us.

Today let us renew our commitment to pray, to pray without getting weary and pray, supporting one another in prayer. We can form wonderful human communities based on prayer and love. Let us pray!


